

CHS Booster Meeting Minutes November 16, 2022

Meeting called to order at 7:05 pm

ACTIVITIES REPORT- SCOTT THOMAS

- Powderpuff game was well attended and great to have this event again. Seniors won!
- 15 of the student leadership students were able to attend the Oregon Association of Student Councils conference.
- Student leadership continues to work on events and they set a “100 small things” goal, hoping to host 100 small events this year, such as activities at lunch. Currently have done 23.
- 12 students from Butternut Elementary visited the CHS leadership group to get an idea of all that goes into starting a student government.
- 22 Century families were able to receive a Thanksgiving gift as part of the regular food pantry distribution. Families received food gift cards and additional food and supplies to get them through the week.
- Coming up- Coin Food Drive in partnership with the Elks Lodge 11/28-12/16 to support about 628 families in the Hillsboro district.
- No longer doing collection of canned foods, instead collecting funds as this helps families be able to purchase foods that they normally purchase. Plus it helps the Elks save their backs as they no longer need to transport heavy boxes. Last year Century raised about \$22,000! Goal this year is \$15,000. Theme is Mario Kart and advisory classes will hold competitions like a door decorating contest among others.
- Assembly on December 2 for winter sports and to start up the coin food drive.
- Winter Formal in January- may be looking for chaperones to volunteer, if interested need to be cleared to volunteer through the district volunteer process.

ATHLETICS REPORT- MICHELLE GRAY

- Fall sports wrapped up with soccer making it to the playoffs, winter sports started this week. Reminder- Michelle Gray has a great equity lens to get more students involved in sports. Kellar will have enough participants to have four teams this year!
- Girls basketball numbers are a bit down this year but hoping to get more students signed up.
- Conversations have started to discuss the future of a football venue, and would need a bond for that. CHS is a division 6A school and would like to have sufficient seating for all spectators, an area for the band, and safety and security being one of the most important factors.
- Families and players will be asked for feedback.
