- Welcome to the 2021-2022 school year! Great to be back in person and see parents and students at the drive thru event.
- Current enrollment count is over 1500 students, ~128 more students than forecasted
- Over 11 new teachers also new classified staff, new counselors, and still have some positions to fill
- Funds were available this year to have the Media center open for 6 hours/day (M-F)
- Teachers were able to reach 1042 families during the connection calls in the last 2 days, they will continue to attempt to reach out to the rest of the families
- Based on feedback, continuing with Advisory class just not every day. Will have grade level lessons and Ms. Guise will inform parents what upcoming lessons will be, in the weekly newsletter.
- This week in Advisory students will be able to request a locker if they want one, also reviewing ID numbers for lunch.
- Will be ordering some Jag swag- shirts for all students, will have a survey for shirt sizes, in Advisory.
- Text books will be checked out during class if needed
- Jazz band will be in Zero period
- If students need schedule correction, complete the schedule correction form or contact a counselor.
- Last year's yearbook scheduled to be delivered in late September and handed out to students, school will reach out to 2021 graduates for pick up. Can still purchase one through the Century store
- School meals
 - Breakfast and lunch at no cost to students this year

- If a student qualifies for the Free/Reduced lunch program, complete the application for additional benefits such as waived or reduced sport fees, AP exam fees, and more.

- School visitors need to sign in at the office and can be there for a very short time.
