### **Activities Director Report- Mr. Scott Thomas**

- Homecoming activities had great turnouts and student participation
  - Assembly had to be split into four instead of two to be held inside because of the rain, band performed, homecoming court was recognized, overall students seemed to enjoy it
  - BBQ raised just about \$500!
  - Bonfire was a soaker but students showed up.
- Winter Spirit Week will be pushed out to February- more details in January
- Thanksgiving baskets- CHS clubs and groups are partnering with The Salvation Army to adopt 24 families.
  - Asking for a gift card donation and small basket of items instead of the totes of food and supplies
  - Boosters have adopted a family and will be collecting donations through the Century online store, meet in person, or drop off at the Century office
  - Will be delivered on 11/23 for families to pick up on 11/24
- Elks canned food drive is changing this year to the Coin Food Drive
  - Elks will be supporting 650 families and will also switch to a family friendly gift card instead of food donations.

- Century Collective, Century's food pantry, will be looking for food donations to support Century families over winter break, more information to come
- Overall students are excited for the opportunity to participate in activities and are enjoying every chance they get. As soon as the district allows, the student leadership will begin to plan for more in person activities such as dances.
