

CHS Booster Meeting Minutes January 12, 2022

Meeting called to order at 7:05 pm

Activities Director Report- MR. SCOTT THOMAS

- Canned food drive transitioned to a Coin drive this year. Were able to raise just under \$25,000 for the Elks Lodge! Elks were able to purchase gifts for families and family friendly gift cards.
- Held assemblies with choir and dance performances along with activities.
- No winter formal dance this year but will still find a way to recognize the service court. Students are nominated to the service court by teachers for volunteer hours.
- Planning for Jag Fest and also a back up plan in case things change
- Spring musical scheduled for early March, taking it on a week by week basis to determine if changes need to happen.

ATHLETICS REPORT- Ms. Guise on behalf of MR. JEREMY CORWIN

- Temporary spectator limit
- Reevaluate at beginning of February
- Have been cancellations/postponed games due to a surge in cases. Forest Grove game was canceled because FG is closed at the moment, they transitioned to remote learning
- Registration for Spring sports begins next week with Spring season starting on Feb 27

PRINCIPAL REPORT- MARTHA GUISE

- Forecasting is just around the corner, students will receive information in their Advisory classes
- Trying to preserve the Freshman flyup (when incoming 9th graders visit Century)
- Semester 1 coming to an end, will not be a formal finals week schedule, will continue with a regular schedule.
- Discussions of changing Advisory class to an "Access" class, more study hall class where students will have opportunities for support. Still lots to discuss before a decision is made.
- High count of staff out, mostly classified staff. District office has done a phenomenal job supporting with sub coverage so Century is doing okay.
- Ms. Guise asks students for feedback on new teachers, loves to hear positive feedback
- Attendance is low this week, was about 81% on Friday. Some parents have decided to keep students home in an abundance of caution.
- Principals are meeting weekly or in daily contact to share ideas, discuss how things are going
- District has set up a testing site for district staff who have symptoms or received a close contact notification and are required to test.

- Goal is to have staff trained to have students self administer tests, with parental permission, at school. Hoping to start this next week if they can obtain tests
- The goal is to keep schools open, activities and athletics going. In case there is a move to remote learning, teachers have contracted for a 1 day planning day. Have been working with staff new to Century/HSD this year to get them familiar with digital tools they may need to use if a move to remote is needed.
- At home tests are being accepted for students to return to school if they were in isolation because it is very difficult to get appointments for testing or purchase at home tests.
- Kids are wearing their masks but do need to be reminded to wear them correctly over their noses.
- Guidance on COVID isolation table

<p>Student has primary symptoms of COVID-19 OR has tested positive for COVID-19, regardless of vaccination status</p>	<p>Student has come in close contact with someone who has COVID-19</p>
<p>Student will need to isolate at home for at least 10 days from the onset of symptoms or date of a positive test. Student may return to school after 10 days, as long as they have been fever-free for at least 24 hours without the aid of medication and symptoms are improving.</p>	<p>IF the student is <u>vaccinated</u> and <u>asymptomatic</u>, there is no need to quarantine; however, testing is recommended within 5-7 days of exposure.</p> <p>IF the student is <u>unvaccinated</u> and <u>asymptomatic</u>, they will need to quarantine for at least 7 days; if they receive a negative COVID-19 test within 5-7 days of exposure, they may return to school on day 8.</p>

Scholarship Committee- Voted and passed on a proposal to change the scholarship criteria. At least one scholarship has been awarded to a graduating senior of a Booster member. Proposal that if there is only 1 qualified applicant for the Booster member scholarship, then that student will not automatically be awarded the scholarship but will instead be scored with the general applicants.
