- Parent Teacher Conferences were a success. CHS has seen an increase in participation over the years. 329 in 2017, 580 in 2018 and 2019 715 contacts by phone, email, or meeting outside of conference times, of which 617 were in person during the scheduled conference times.
- Deadline to register for AP exams is quickly approaching and staff is reaching out to families who still need to register.
- Discussion on Dual Credit vs. AP credits. Students should check with counselor and create a plan that works best for them.
- Wellness lessons on Stress to be held in November. Toxic Stress will be held in December. Lessons will be during access time.
 - All students should have received a safety sticker for the back of their ID with contact information for mental health resources and community supports.
- American Education week is Nov. 18th to 22nd. Treats for staff members will be provided. Parents encouraged to send an appreciation note to school staff.
