May 13, 2020

Meeting called to order at 7:10 pm

Athletics Report- Mr. Dennis Rice

- Nimo is a finalist for Oregon Female Wrestler Athlete of the Year
- Coaches are connecting with ~ 700 + student athletes through Team app and Google classroom with optional workouts
- Working on plan for senior athlete recognitions
 - True Jag award for students who played in a sport all 4 years
 - Claw award
- Hired head girls soccer coach, Cris Lewis
- Still searching for boys soccer coach
- Will wait to have guidance from OSAA and state on how Fall sports events will look like

Activities Director Report- Mr. Scott Thomas

- Banner has been placed outside of school with all seniors names
- The Tech department printed signs for all seniors and over 30 staff members worked to deliver them
- Working on a plan to award and recognize students with 130 department awards
- Voting was concluded virtually for leadership officer positions
- Will plan activities for next year once more information is available on large gatherings

Principal Report- Martha Guise

Graduation Plan

- Information was released seniors will have an opportunity to pick up cords and medals, recorded "walking" and have pictures taken. The recordings will be put together into a graduation video
- Keep traditions of having student speaker, staff speaker, student performances, and a short principal speech
- Senior awards night and assembly- create a video or slideshow highlighting key elements of awards
- A graduation program (booklet/brochure) will also be created

Distance Learning

- Century Jags weekly newsletter has been moved to go out on Friday instead of Monday, information is available regarding resources available
- At end of 3rd quarter there were 460 students with Incompletes in one or more classes. This has been reduced by about 115 in last week and anticipate to reduce by about 90 + within next week
- Access issues were made more prevalent. About 40 students were in need of paper packets at the start. Currently there are about 10 students still working through paper packets, not necessarily due to wifi or internet access issues

- 130 Chromebooks were shared with Elementary feeder schools

Furlough, Staffing, Budgets

- Currently temporary non-instructional staff were laid off, CHS lost 2 or 3 IAs
- Furlough of 1 day, Fridays, will go into effect this week.
- Freeze on spending which will help reduce needed loss in staffing next year
- Estimating a savings of \$3.5 to \$4.2 million
- Calendar has been adjusted for next year, some professional development days are now instructional days, see district website for revised calendar.
- Will know more on budget after the May 20th state budget forecast
- Schools have been asked to draft potential budgets using 5%, 10%, and 15% reductions, other area districts are asking schools to draft using a 40% reduction.
- Mr. Hopper, math teacher, will be retiring

Other updates

- No information on SAT/ACT reschedules
- AP exams underway this week and next week
- Summer school will be offered using PLATO online classes. More information to come as it becomes available
- Century's grounds and buildings continue to be closed to the public, includes the track and field
- Contact Ms. Guise if any personal belongings still need to be picked up
