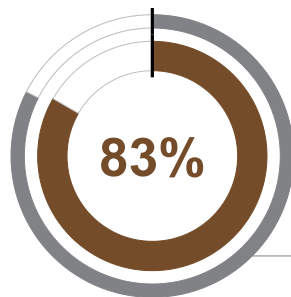
Special Note

Students who attended more than 90% of their enrolled school days.

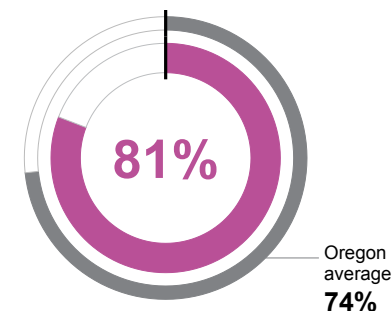

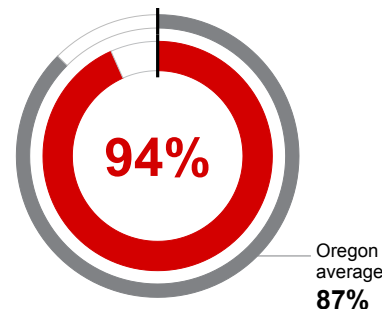
ON-TRACK TO GRADUATE

Students earning one-quarter of graduation credits in their 9th grade year.



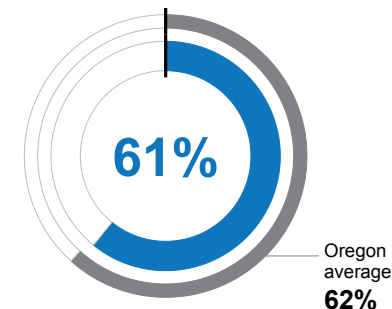
FIVE-YEAR COMPLETION

School Goals

Hilhi's goals for the 2021-22 school year are: We will provide all students with support to access instruction, facilitating college and career readiness for all while increasing academic rigor through the 5Ds Instructional framework, with a focus on developing and implementing academic language and AVID strategies. We will know 100% of students by name, strength, and need. We will continue increasing 9th-grade on-track and on-time graduation.

State Goals

The Oregon Department of Education is partnering with school districts and local communities to ensure a 90% on-time, four year graduation rate by 2025. To progress toward this goal, the state will prioritize efforts to improve attendance, provide a well-rounded education, invest in implementing culturally responsive practices, and promote continuous improvement to close opportunity and achievement gaps for historically and currently underserved students.

Safe & Welcoming Environment

Many upgrades to school safety have been completed at Hilhi thanks to bond funding, including upgraded door locks and re-keying; card access on outside doors; upgraded fencing and gate systems; an updated school-wide camera system; door alarms; alert buttons at the front desk; video/audio at the entrance to screen visitors; and new concrete at the front of the building, which included improving the existing ADA ramp and adding a second ramp. Hilhi also has all new furniture, updated HVAC, and new technology in every room.

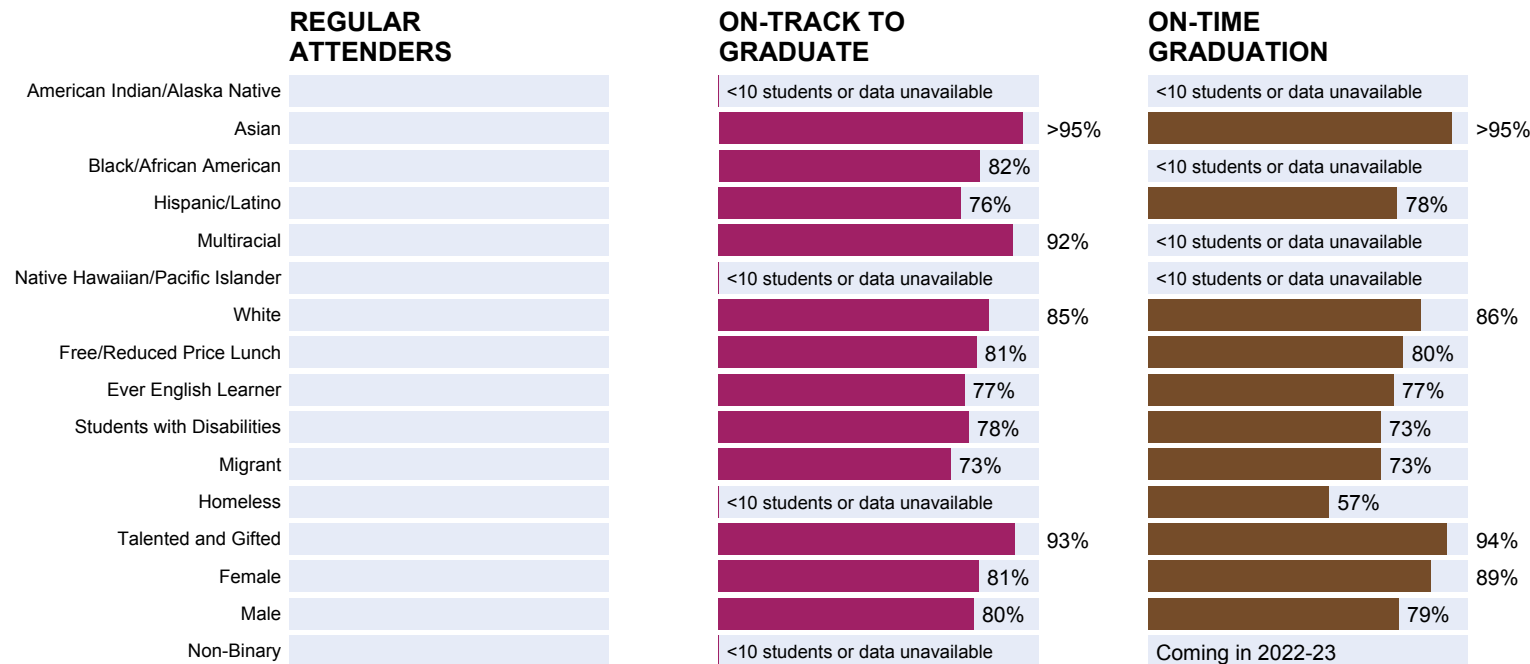

About Our School

ADVANCED COURSEWORK

Hilhi is proud to be the only high school in the Hillsboro School District offering the International Baccalaureate program. We offer IB courses in English, French, Spanish, Biology, Physics, Visual Arts, Math, History of the Americas, Theory of Knowledge, Business, Industrial Technology, Health Sciences, and Music. Hilhi is also a Dual Language school and offers Science, Math, Social Science, and Language Arts classes in Spanish as well as English.

CAREER & TECHNICAL EDUCATION

Hilhi offers the following career-technical education programs: Industrial Technology and Engineering Systems, Graphic Design, Communication and Media, Automotive Technology, Business Education, Computer Technology, Biotechnology, and Veterinary Science. This year we are adding Sports Medicine and Early Childhood Education.

EXTRACURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

Hilhi's extracurricular activities include OSAA Athletics, OSAA Activities, OSAA Arts (Band, Choir, Theater, and Marching Band), 31 Academic and Service Clubs, and 3+ Theatrical productions each year. We also offer a variety of STEM activities which include: Robotics (multiple teams), Computer Programming, and Si Se Puede STEM camp.

PARENT & COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT

At Hilhi, we aim to reach and involve everyone in our school community through surveys, parent nights, Latino parent nights, and middle school family events. Events include AVID nights, Back-to-School night, IB night, dual language nights, and parent/teacher conferences. This year, we are starting a monthly cultural event open to students and parents. As a staff, we also reach out to families through home visits, monthly newsletters, and our family liaison.
