



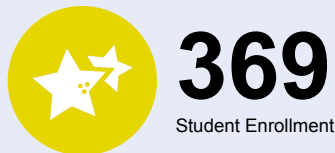

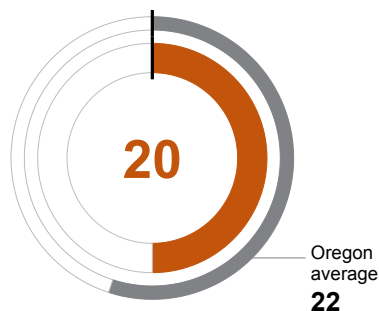

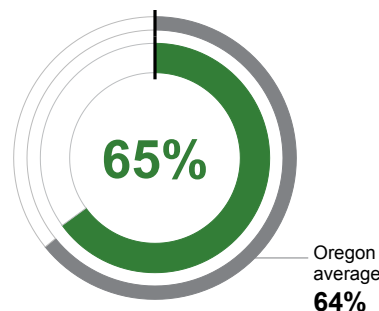
CLASS SIZE

INDIVIDUAL STUDENT PROGRESS

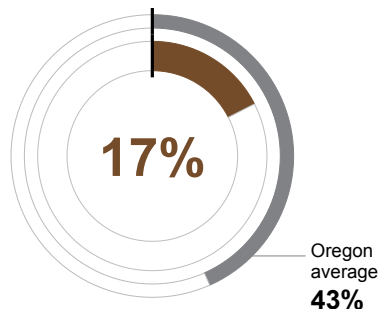
Year-to-year progress in English language arts and mathematics.

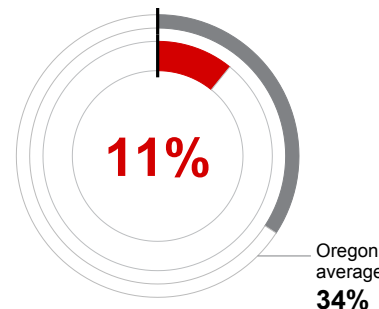
ENGLISH LANGUAGE ARTS

Students meeting state grade-level expectations.



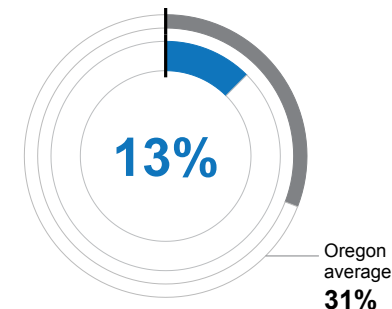
MATHEMATICS

COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT

Eastwood partners with a variety of businesses and community organizations in order to support the needs of our families and students. With community support, we are able to provide these programs: Weekly Backpack Food Program; school supply donations; on-site counseling with Life Stance; clothing drive; snack donation; and partnership with Just Create Community, LLC for Community Greeters Program, Community Readers program, and Pen Pals Program. We will also have a Beautification Committee that is centered around the building of our new garden and upkeep activities around our school.
