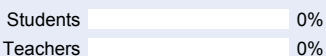

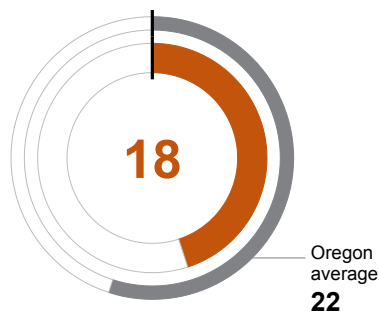

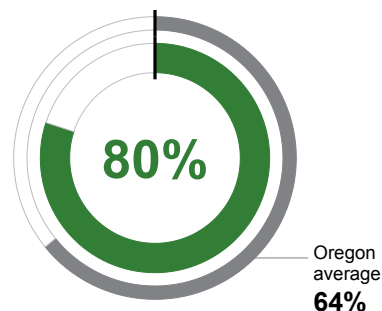

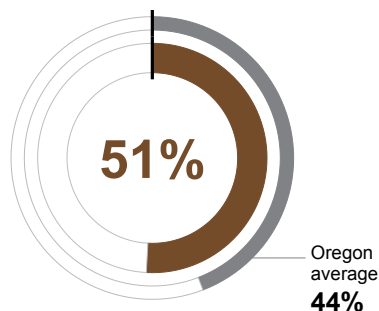

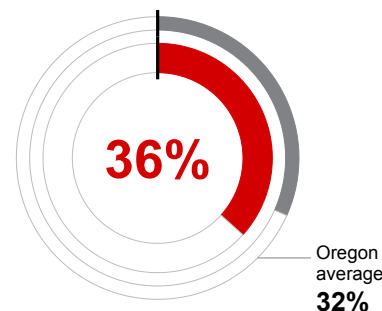
ENGLISH LANGUAGE ARTS

Students meeting state grade-level expectations.



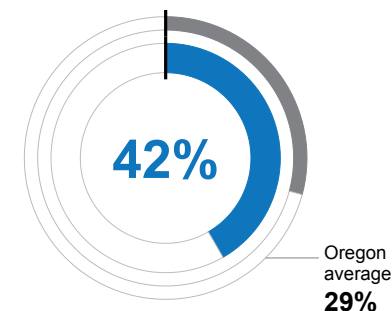
MATHEMATICS

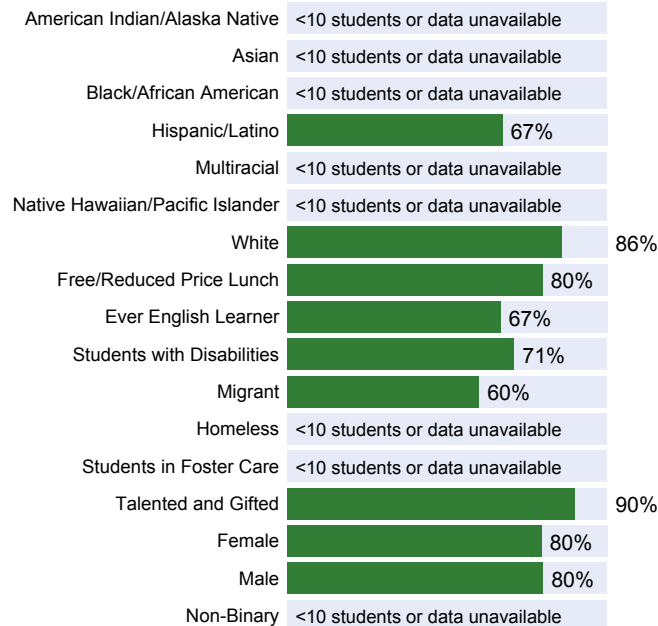

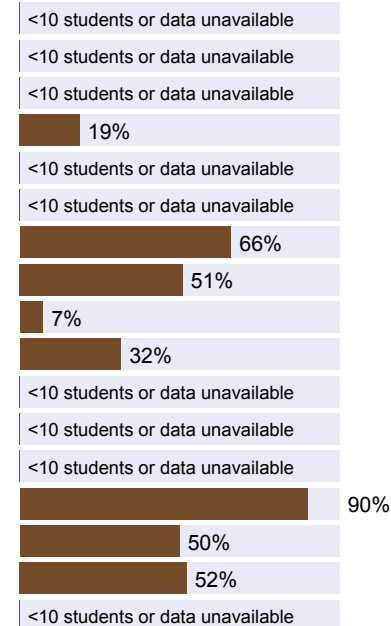

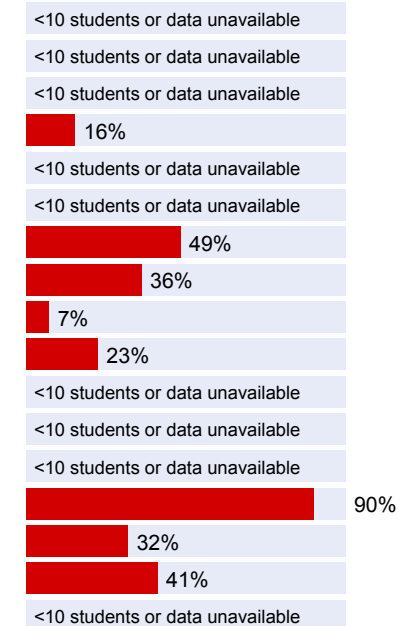

About Our School

BULLYING, HARASSMENT, AND SAFETY POLICIES

Our number one priority and goal is to ensure students are safe. To that end, we have a network of adults, systems, structures, protocols, and other supports we leverage to keep our school as safe as possible. Ensuring safety also means that positive, respectful, and responsible behavior is expected at all times. Our school has implemented Positive Behavior Interventions and Supports (PBIS) school-wide. This program encompasses teaching and practicing expectations in all areas of the school, and rewarding students for exhibiting positive behaviors. Our staff supports PBIS with the Harmony SEL curriculum. Through classroom and small group lessons, students learn to manage emotions and problem-solve.

EXTRACURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

Our extracurricular activities consist of Beginning Band, Crazy 8's, Garden Club, Math/ELA academic language support, and Girls STEAM club

PARENT ENGAGEMENT

Groner has a very active PTO that meets monthly to provide support for students and staff. The parent-teacher organization encourages participation in family events and fundraising opportunities. Volunteer opportunities are abundant and parents spend many hours at the school, providing much appreciated support to students and staff. Parents are encouraged to attend student-teacher conferences as well as assemblies and performances at the school.

COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT

Groner partners very closely with the community of Scholls. Community support focuses primarily on Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts, and Math (STEAM) opportunities. We collaborate with parents, retirees, businesses, faith communities, and community organizations to bring additional resources and support students' success by volunteering in classrooms, reading to and with students, providing speakers & community resources, supporting our food backpack program and pantry, running extracurricular activities, chaperoning field trips, and completing school clean-up projects.
