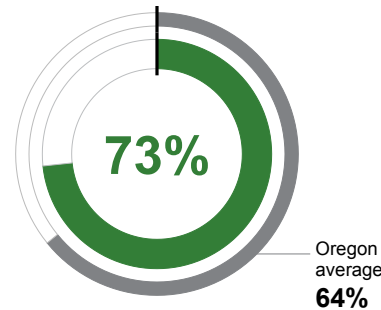

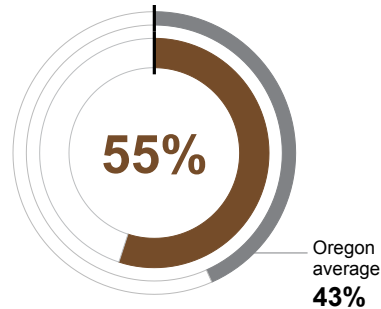

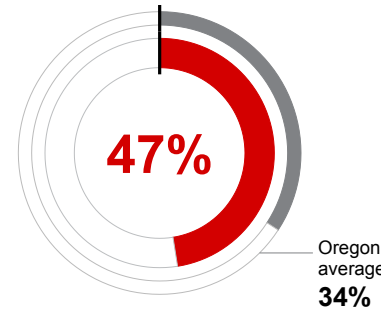
ENGLISH LANGUAGE ARTS

Academic Progress

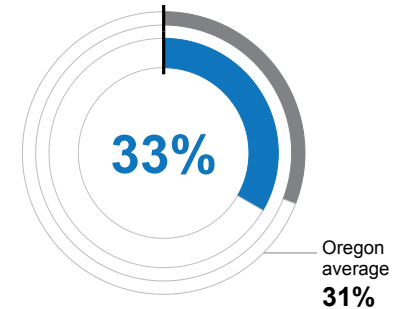
INDIVIDUAL STUDENT PROGRESS

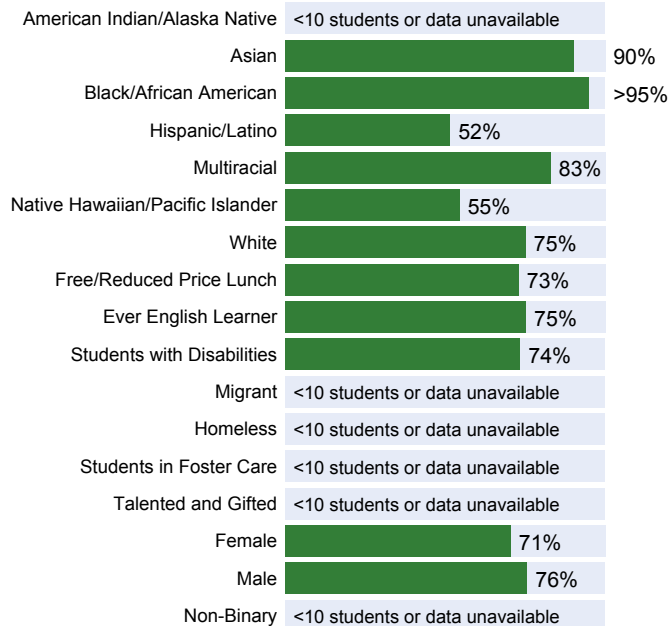

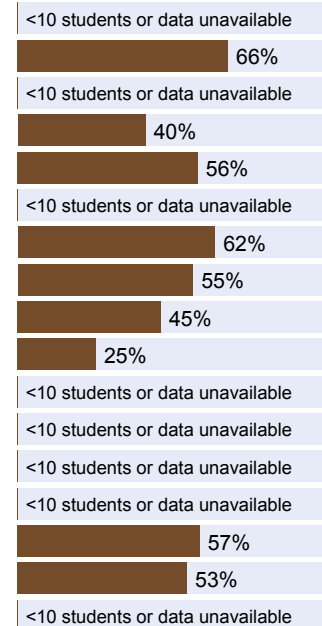

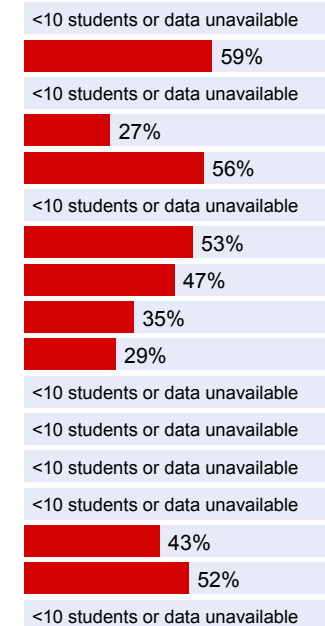

In addition to these events, our PTO hosts monthly events such as movie nights, BINGO, paint nights, and more.
