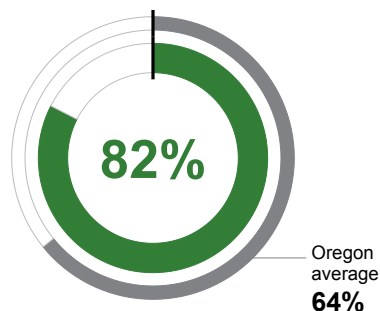

INDIVIDUAL STUDENT PROGRESS

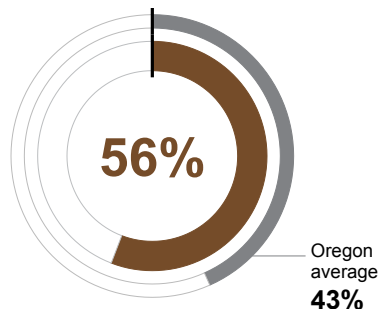

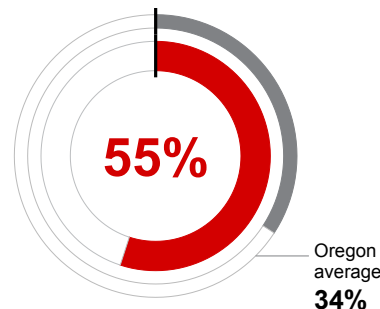
ENGLISH LANGUAGE ARTS

Students meeting state grade-level expectations.



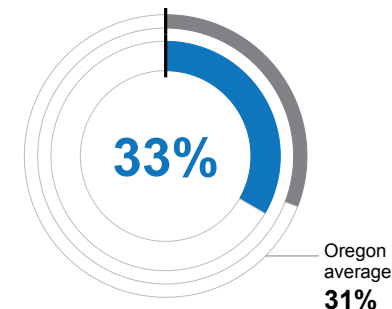
MATHEMATICS

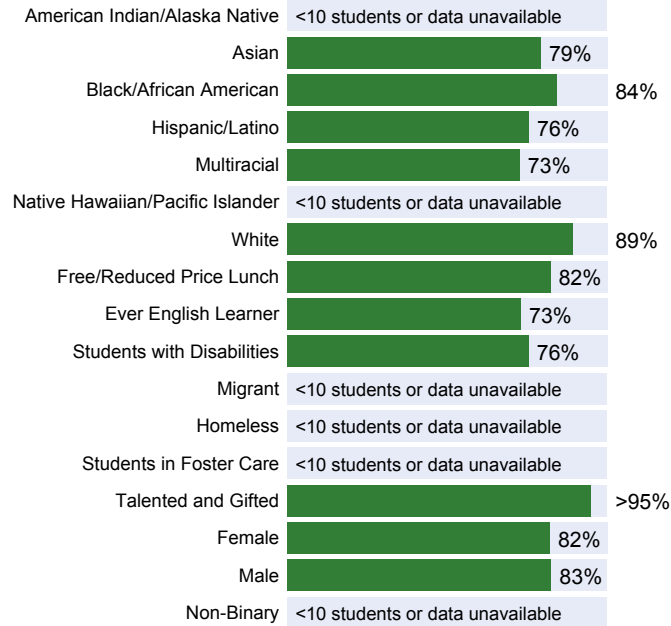

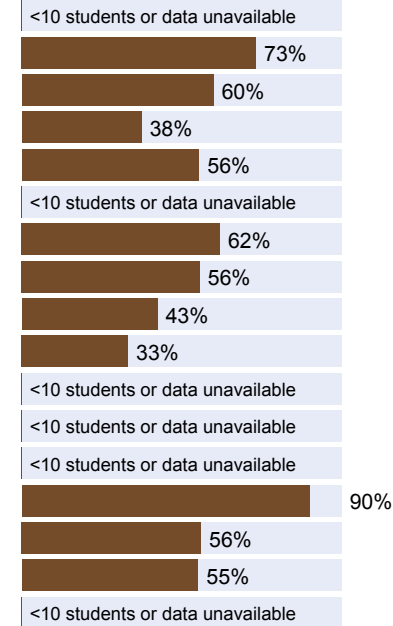

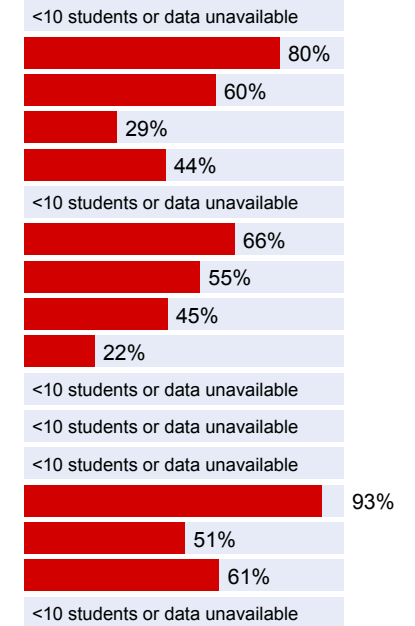

About Our School

BULLYING, HARASSMENT, AND SAFETY POLICIES

Our number one priority and goal is to ensure students feel safe, valued, and welcomed on a daily basis. To that end, we have a network of adults, systems, structures, protocols, and other supports we leverage to keep our school as safe as possible. We believe in restorative practices and working collaboratively with families to support our students as they develop their social and emotional skill set. Ensuring safety also means that positive, respectful, and responsible behavior is expected at all times and in all places. We do not tolerate bullying or harassment. EXTRACURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

At Lenox, we strive to offer a variety of opportunities for our students such as Oregon Battle of the Books, Band, Choir, Garden Club, 6th grade Student Self-Managers, TAG program, Summer Learning Camp, and Booster-sponsored activities like Win with Reading and Science Fair. This year, we added a STEAM club that served over thirty-five students and had a focus on diverse individuals who have contributed to the development of and research in the area of STEAM.

PARENT ENGAGEMENT

At Lenox, we prioritize our partnership with families in order to support our students' overall educational experiences and success. While the pandemic has impacted in-person opportunities, we have leveraged virtual options to be able to connect. Our goal is to involve as many families as possible. Back-to-School Night, Welcome Back Conferences, Monthly PRIDE! Assemblies, and Science Fair were great ways to connect with families and invite volunteers to support our school. The Lenox Booster Club is also an active support to our students and community and is made up of hard-working individuals that pool their talents to provide practical support for our school.

COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT

Lenox strives to create positive connections with our community to ensure the development of our students' career- and college-readiness skills, as well as to build their appreciation of the importance of community involvement. Examples include collaboration with volunteers from Intel, Washington County Sheriff's Department and other businesses/organizations; school beautification projects; Right Brain Initiative Partnership; Read Across America Day; Virtual Field Trips and Guest Speakers; and Booster Club-sponsored events such as Dining Night Out. We also partner with the YMCA to offer before and after-school care for our families to ensure that our students have an extension of their school day in a safe and supportive environment.
