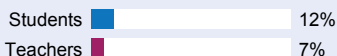

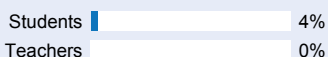

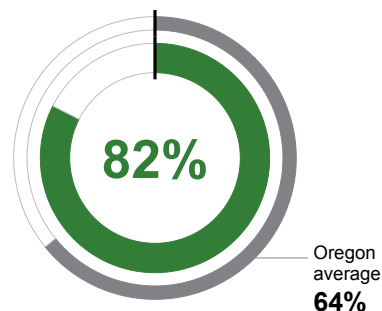

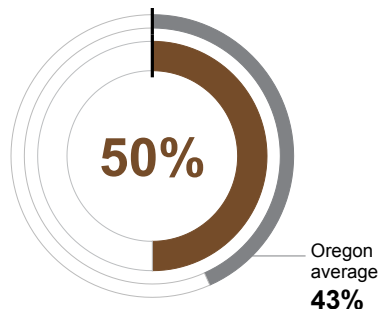

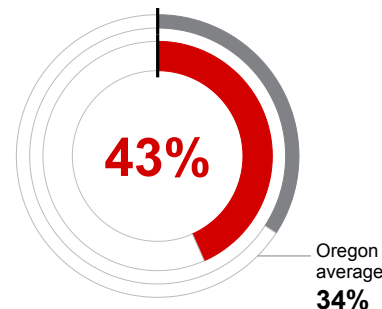
ENGLISH LANGUAGE ARTS

Academic Progress

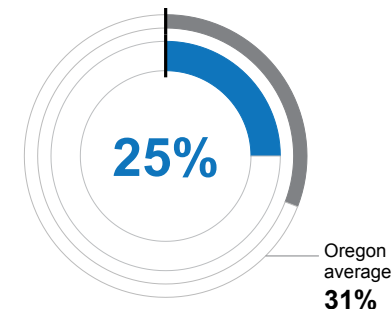
INDIVIDUAL STUDENT PROGRESS

School Goals

In 2021-22, we focused on academic goals related to math and literacy, attendance, family engagement, and positive behavior. School-wide initiatives included small group and 1:1 support, attendance initiatives and continuous monitoring, fostering a sense of belonging, and focusing on math and reading best practices in professional learning communities for subsequent implementation in the classroom.

State Goals

The Oregon Department of Education is partnering with school districts and local communities to ensure a 90% on-time, four year graduation rate by 2025. To progress toward this goal, the state will prioritize efforts to improve attendance, provide a well-rounded education, invest in implementing culturally responsive practices, and promote continuous improvement to close opportunity and achievement gaps for historically and currently underserved students.

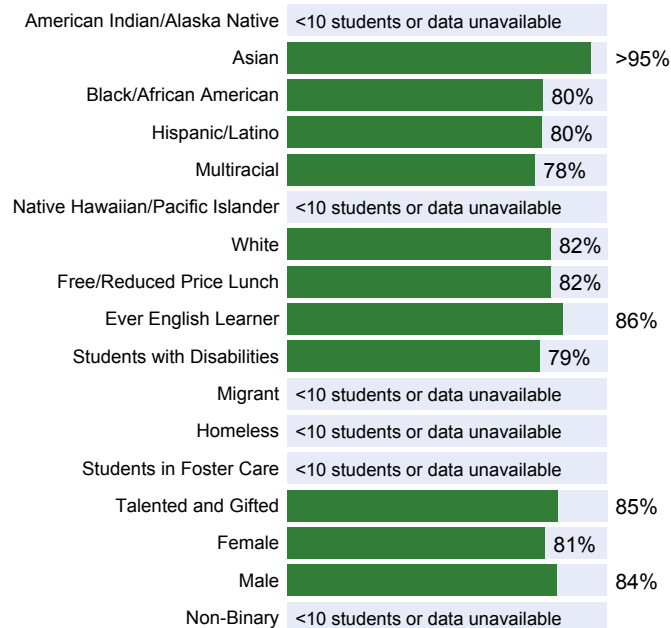

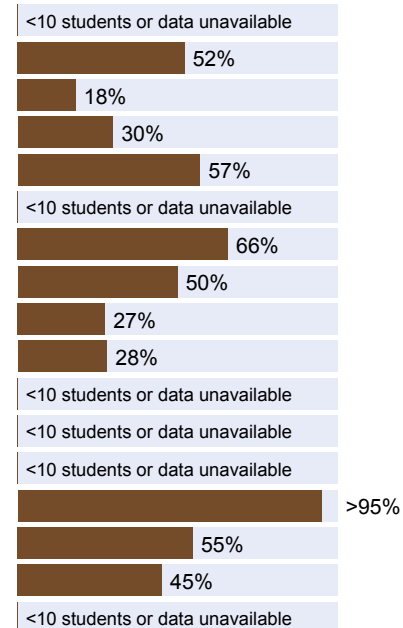

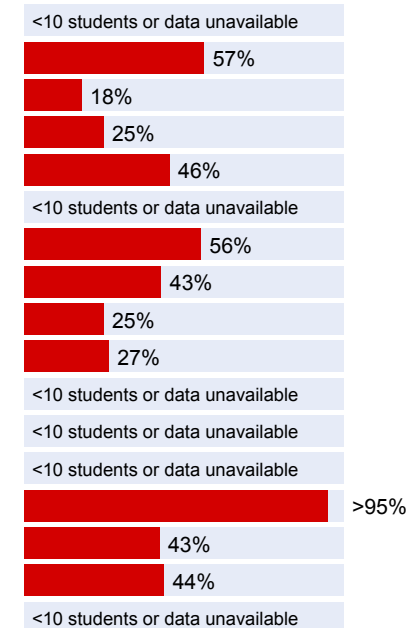

COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT

Orengo Elementary is situated on the ancestral lands of the Tualatin Kalapuyas, in the historic Orengo neighborhood of Hillsboro, Oregon. Connecting with our community demonstrates interdependence and prepares students for their future. Examples of partnerships include Canned food drive with the local ELKS, Hillsboro Parks and Recreation department at Orengo Woods Nature Park, Intel volunteers, Band and Choir community performances, language clubs through Pacific University, artists in residence through the Right Brain Initiative, Playworks Recess program, and field trips.
