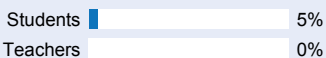

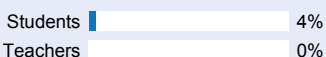

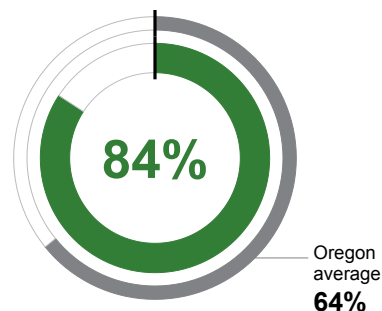

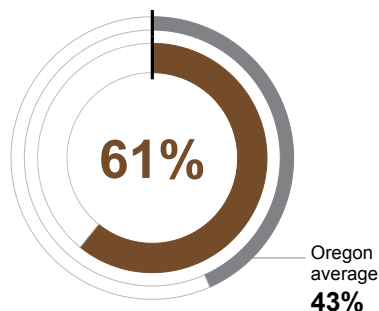

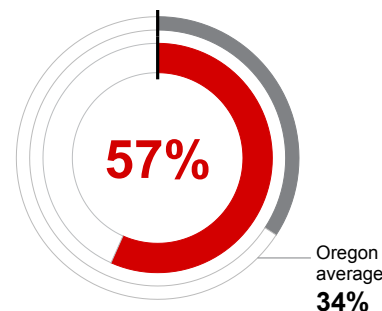
ENGLISH LANGUAGE ARTS

Academic Progress

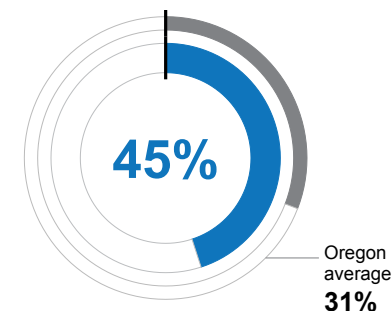
INDIVIDUAL STUDENT PROGRESS

School Goals

At Patterson, our goal is to support every student in their academic, social, and emotional growth and learning. Our team provides rigorous, standards-based instruction to meet students at their instructional level. We are committed to an inclusion model of service that fosters peer connections and high expectations for all students. Our three school-wide goals for the 2021-22 school year included reading with our new curriculum adoption, language development, and student safety and belonging. Our top priority was supporting our students as we transitioned back into our building for in-person learning.

State Goals

The Oregon Department of Education is partnering with school districts and local communities to ensure a 90% on-time, four year graduation rate by 2025. To progress toward this goal, the state will prioritize efforts to improve attendance, provide a well-rounded education, invest in implementing culturally responsive practices, and promote continuous improvement to close opportunity and achievement gaps for historically and currently underserved students.

Creating a safe and welcoming school environment is our top priority. This year we moved to the M.A.G.I.C. acronym and systems designed to teach students how to Make eye contact or give your full attention, Accept mistakes and move forward, Get up and go for it or take Initiative, work as a team, and Celebrate the success of others. 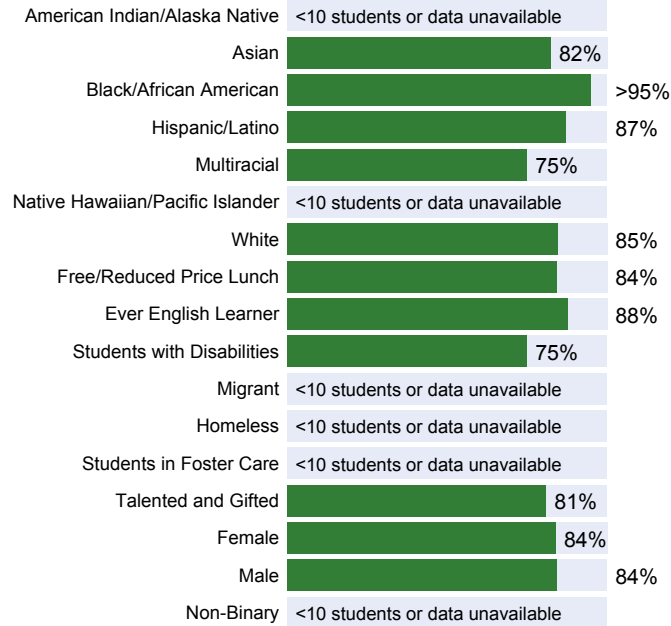

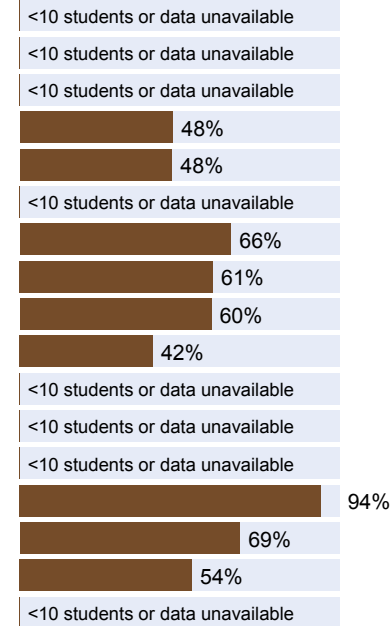

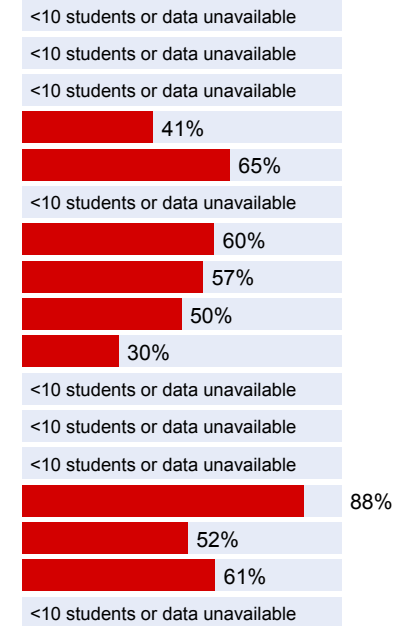

PARENT ENGAGEMENT

We have a high percentage of family involvement, including regular weekly volunteering and special event coverage. Principal chats offer an opportunity for families to ask questions, provide feedback, and learn about upcoming events and activities. There are many opportunities to engage with our school community and we encourage all parents to reach out and connect with us to get involved.

COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT

Our Parent Booster Club runs many fun community events. These were limited during the 2021-22 school year, but we look forward to the return of many annual events in 2022-23.
