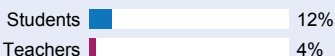

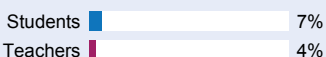

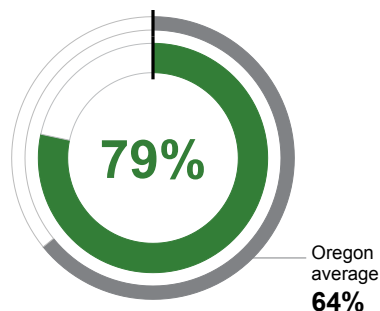

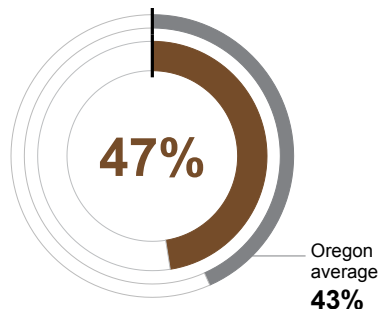

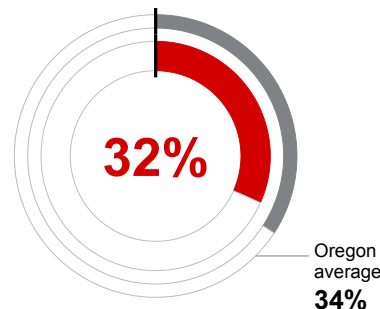

Academic Progress

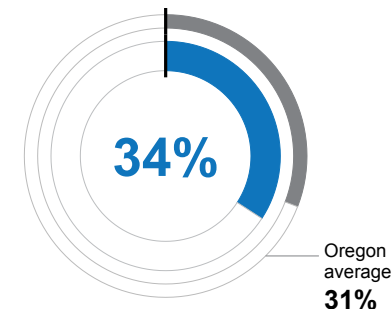
INDIVIDUAL STUDENT PROGRESS

School Goals

At Tobias, we believe that all students can grow academically and socially, so we are focusing on strengthening our core instruction in math and language as well as using differentiated, small group instruction to meet students' needs. Particular attention is being given to supporting students with their academic and English language development. We are also being intentional about enhancing social-emotional growth during our morning meetings. By doing so, we will ensure all students have consistent access and support needed to build and extend their academic and social skills.

State Goals

The Oregon Department of Education is partnering with school districts and local communities to ensure a 90% on-time, four year graduation rate by 2025. To progress toward this goal, the state will prioritize efforts to improve attendance, provide a well-rounded education, invest in implementing culturally responsive practices, and promote continuous improvement to close opportunity and achievement gaps for historically and currently underserved students.

We recognize the worth of all students and are committed to providing a safe and inclusive space for everyone, regardless of their race, color, religion, immigration status, or any other basis. Students learn best when they feel safe and valued. Classes hold daily morning meetings where staff and students create strong relationships and practice positive social interactions. 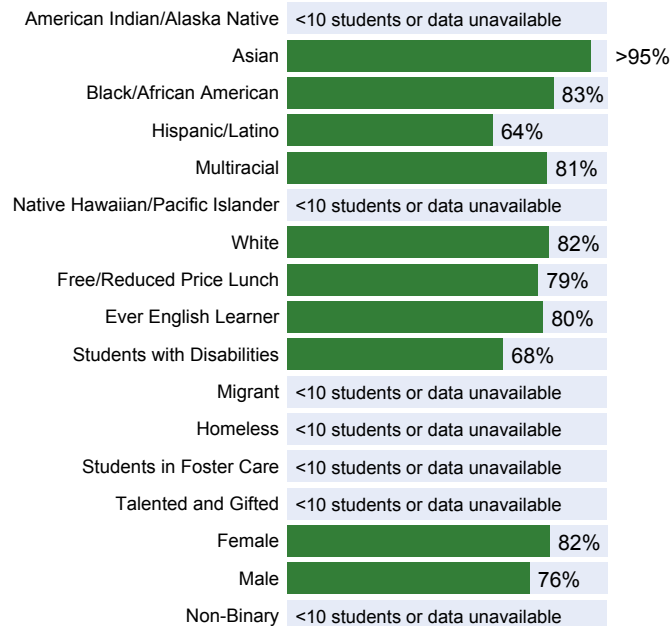

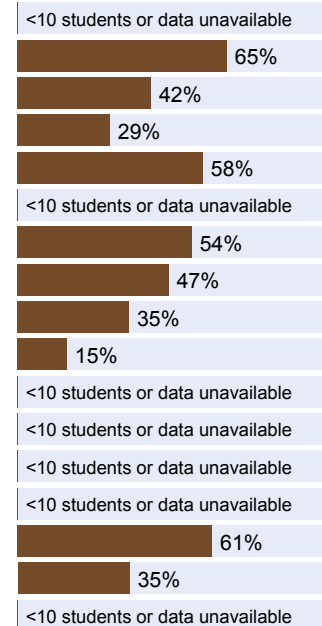

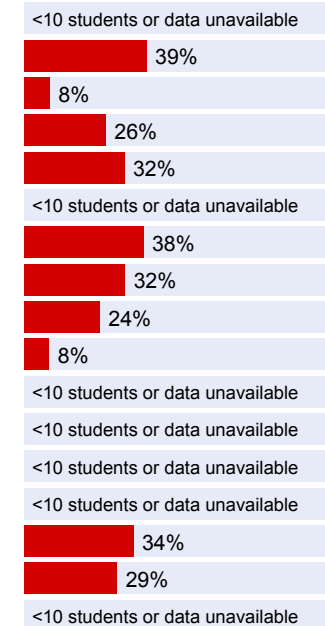
