





Students meeting state grade-level expectations.




MATHEMATICS

School Goals

Our primary goal is the achievement and growth of every student. We are committed to engaging students in their learning by teaching to rigorous standards and fostering critical thinking. We are proud to have a fully-implemented Dual Language program PreK-6th grade. Our past strengths include our focus on developing a positive school climate and culture. We implement Trauma-Responsive strategies and have developed a wellness room to teach students self-regulation skills. For the coming school year, our school improvement plan will focus on Writing, Academic Language Development, and Social-Emotional Learning.

State Goals

The Oregon Department of Education is partnering with school districts and local communities to ensure a 90% ontime, four year graduation rate by 2027. To progress toward this goal, the state will prioritize efforts to improve attendance, provide a well-rounded education, invest in implementing culturally responsive practices, and promote continuous improvement to close opportunity and achievement gaps for historically and currently underserved students.

Safe & Welcoming Environment

We are committed to providing a safe and inclusive space for everyone, where diversity in race, ethicity, religion, immigration status, or gender is celebrated. We believe students learn best when they feel safe and valued, and that a positive, proactive approach fosters a productive learning environment. Staff are trained in a variety of positive behavior supports including PAX, PBIS, Second Steps Socio-Emotional curriculum, and Restorative Justice practices. We explicitly teach students expected behaviors and have reinforcement systems in place to recognize students who do well.




