Hillsboro School District Thanks Community for Past Bond Support

Final collection on 1994 bond to construct Century High School will occur November 1

October 25, 2013, Hillsboro, OR – Hillsboro School District is pleased to announce that \$2,920,000 of bond debt will be paid off with collections from this year’s property taxes.

Voters approved the request to sell \$35,800,000 worth of General Obligation bonds in November 1994 to build the District’s third high school: Century, and complete other small projects. The outstanding amount of that bond was refinanced to a lower interest rate in 1998, and currently accounts for \$0.28/\$1,000 of assessed property value in the combined bond rate for property owners.

Today, Century is the District’s largest high school, with an enrollment of 1,714 students. Since its construction, the District added a fourth high school, Liberty, in 2003, and is now looking at growth patterns to determine when and where new schools—elementary, middle and high—will need to be built in the future.

“We offer the community our sincerest thanks for the commitment and support they’ve shown to our district over the years,” expresses Superintendent Mike Scott. “Your investments are significant and appreciated as we strive to fulfill our mission and responsibility to provide the best possible educational experience to our students.”
