Factors Contributing to the School Bus Driver Shortage

- Worker Shortage & Increased Options: Uber, Lyft, Amazon Flex
- Enhanced Unemployment Benefits
- Impact of the Pandemic
 - Expanded NYS testing requirementsfor school bus drivers
 - Bus companies going out of business

On Long Island, bus companies do not have enough bus drivers to adequately service all of their routes.

- Buses running with prolonged delays or not running
- More students on buses
 - Consolidating routes
 - Severe limitations on adding bus service Impacting athletic transportation and field trips



- * Develop bus routes
- * Bid new transportation routes
- * Assign routes to bus companies





- * Send information and bus lists to schools
- * Mail bus passes
