GLOBAL GOAL: ACADEMIC

Date Adopted/Last Revised: May 2021 Global Goals

School District 27J exists so that students have the knowledge and skills for present and future success with results justifying the expenditure of resources.

1.3 Beginning in the fall of 2021, the academic status of the school district 27J and individual schools within 27J will be measured by the 27J Schools Academic Dashboard. By the fall of 2025, 80% of district managed schools will have an accomplishing rating on the 27J Schools Academic Dashboard.

The 27J Academic Dashboard includes multiple attributes to describe the academic growth and achievement for each school. The attributes within the dashboard include internal measures that can be utilized to support continuous improvement throughout the school year while also including state assessments. The measures included are:

- Colorado Measures of Academic Success (CMAS)
- 27J District Common Assessments - Acadience DIBELS Next Achievement and Growth
- On-Track Measures - Grades for Middle School, Credits Earned, Demonstration, and Graduation for High School

When combined, a school's performance toward the priority attributes provide information about a school's overall academic growth and performance. The 27J Student Achievement Dashboard provides a single score and represents a continuous improvement rating (entering, emerging, developing, accomplishing or leading). The table below shows the dashboard ranges for each continuous improvement rating.

0 up to 4.99	Entering
5 up to 9.99	Emerging
10 up to 19.99	Developing
20 up to 34.99	Accomplishing
35 up to 50	Leading

- When comparing 2021-22 Quarter 4 to 2022-23 Quarter 4
 - Fifteen schools increased the Academic Growth and Performance score
 - Seven schools showed a decrease in Academic Growth and Performance score
 - Southlawn was a new school in 2022-2023
- 27J Schools remained in Developing rating. The Academic Growth and Performance points earned increased by 2.4 compared to the end of the 2020-2021 school year.

At the end of 2022-23 School-Year:

- **5 Schools (21.7%) were Accomplishing (Brantner, Reunion, Southlawn, Thimmig, and West Ridge)**
- 10 Schools (43.5%) were Developing (Northeast, Padilla, Pennock, Second Creek, South, Southeast, Turnberry, Brighton High School, Prairie View High School, and Riverdale Ridge High School)
- 3 Schools (13%) were Emerging (Henderson, Quist Middle School, and 27J Online Academy)
- 5 Schools (21.7%) were Entering (Overland Trail Middle School, Prairie Middle School, Stuart Middle School, and Vikan Middle School, and Innovations and Options)

The CMAS and PSAT/SAT growth calculation assigns students a score from 1 to 99 that reflects how much they improved compared with other students with similar score histories. A score of 99 means a student did better on the test than 99 percent of students who scored similarly to him the year before. Students who score above 50 are considered to have made more than a year's worth of academic progress in a year's time, whereas students who score below 50 are considered to have made less than a year's worth of progress.

The state also calculates overall growth scores for districts and schools. Below are the aggregate growth scores for each 27J managed school.

27J Common Assessments for English Language Arts and Mathematics in grades K-HS, and Science and Social Studies for grade 6-12 (60% for Elementary/40% for Middle and High School)

27J Common assessments measure student progress toward grade level goals. The common assessments were collaboratively developed by teachers to align directly with our curricular frameworks and state standards. These common assessments provide teachers a snapshot of student performance four times per year for secondary schools and three times per year for elementary schools. The results of these assessments provide teachers with real time information to inform instructional decisions. Data dialogue procedures and continuous improvement processes take place in all 27J schools.

These common assessments are regularly reviewed for validity, reliability, and predictability. There is a strong correlation between student performance on 27J common assessments and state assessments.

Within the 27J Student Achievement Dashboard, achievement is measured by the percent of students who meet or exceed grade level expectations. The Indicator of Growth is based on the percent of students who increase their proficiency level from one assessment cycle to the next. For elementary and middle schools, content data is represented by grade level. However, due to the nature of high school courses, high school data is combined by content area. All of the data below can be disaggregated for school and district use as well.

Acadience DIBELS Next

Foundational Reading Skills are measured through the Acadience DIBELS (Dynamic Indicator of Basic Early Literacy Skills) Next assessments. The tables below show the percentage of students in grades k-3 who score “at benchmark” or “above benchmark” on the DIBELS Next composite score. Students earn a composite score providing the best overall estimate of the student’s reading proficiency. Included in these composite scores are first sound fluency, letter naming, phoneme segmentation, nonsense words, oral fluency, and retell. If a student scores “at benchmark” or “above benchmark”, odds are in favor of achieving later reading outcomes with continued high quality instruction. The cut scores used are criterion-referenced and nationally recognized benchmark.

On-Track: Middle School (Grades) and High School (Credits Earned, Demonstration, and Graduation)

The On-Track measure represents making progress towards graduation. For middle school this is represented by the percent of students who pass all classes each quarter (semester for Overland Trail Middle School). For high school, this is represented in three ways 1) the percent of students who earn the identified number of credits each quarter or semester to demonstrate acceptable progress towards graduation 2) the percent of students who have met the demonstration requirement by 1st quarter of senior year and 3) the percent of students who graduate at the end of 12th grade (This is internal data based on currently enrolled 12th grade students so the data may not match graduation rates published through the Colorado Department of Education.)

Goal - Implementation of each school's UIP

Evidence - 1. Personal Clarity for UIP

- Two goals that connect directly to the 27J Academic Dashboard and Climate/Culture Dashboard.
 - Long Term outcome goal is clearly connected to a theory of action related to adult behaviors selected for their UIP.
 - There are both long term adult behavior changes as well as initial smaller steps toward attainment
 - a. Prioritized Implementation Benchmark
 - b. Identification of a Simple Step and the progression of simple steps towards the Implementation Benchmark
 - The clarity of goal is evident in the adult behaviors that will indicate improvement towards improved outcomes.
2. (Share and own responsibility) This personal clarity for the UIP is shared throughout the school with everyone engaged and empowered to play their role and responsibility.
 3. (Facilitate and coach growth) Schools have a structure for facilitating and coaching (learning how to) these implementation steps.
 4. (Action orientation) School improvement efforts drive action and doing - learning from this doing.
 5. (Perspective) Schools have a structure for collecting implementation data and a process for collaboratively reviewing and responding to this implementation data.

Learning Experiences/Environment -

Explicitly provide learning experiences through Learning Leader Mondays

1. Leadership Development
2. UIP and team time to continuously improve based on the progress of their UIP
 - a. These supported by student achievement specialists
3. Increased personal clarity related to climate culture, academic, and evaluation processes to support schools in their UIP

Individual principal coaching

1. Each school to have a minimum of 2 school support visits per month
 - a. Additional school support visits by directors or student achievement specialists possible
2. Each director to have smaller leveled principal PLC at least twice a month

School UIP data collection

Directors and Specialists collect data specific to the evidence outlined above in a shared data collection form

Processes and structures to continuously improve our practices and actions related to each school's UIP data

1. Director Meetings review student achievement UIP data from schools monthly
2. Student Achievement PLC, made up of specialists and directors, meets twice a month
3. Both data review processes from 1 and 2 result in strategic interventions and support to schools based on this data. Agendas are created to support leaders, assistant principals, coaches in their learning experiences.
4. Director and Executive Director agendas are designed around problem solving and supporting school progress toward their UIP goals
