

# Holden Libraries 2023/24













#### **Elementary**

With a grant from the Holden Foundation, we were able to purchase several types of audio books. The Holden PTO provided a grant for an assembly. Stephen Kozan, founder of ReadyAimWriteKids led interactive presentations for first and second graders. Anderson Ringen's flash fiction was chosen for publication. We provide Library/PLTW lessons, Connie reads to students during SOAR. We provide coding lessons and checkout for all grades. laminator services, tech requests, and requested books for staff.

Middle School The theme for the middle school library this year is The Classics, New and Old. Throughout the library, you will find vignettes that represent classic books. Along with checking out books to classes, shelving books and keeping the library updated and in order, also collaborates with staff and students. Cleans and repairs books as needed. Keeps budgets, orders books, orders supplies and sees that all library needs are met. Fills paper, filament and film and solves problems with copiers, 3D printers and laminator. The library plans school wide events six times a year and supports tech. Lastly, and most importantly, I share my love of literature with the students so they may find the perfect book, which starts them on a path to becoming lifelong readers.

**High School** has had 712 checkouts so far this year. With a grant from the Holden Foundation, we were able to have Gateway Award winning author Mindy McGinnis visit. The Creative Writing class and other English classes enjoyed listening to the author. Eighth grade came over and listened as well. Leading up to the author visit, we had a short story contest. Malea Brewington won first, Carson Moreno took second and Arjon Sherrod won third place. First place received a free lunch with the author, second place got a free book signed by the author, and third place won a gift card to the Eagles coffee shop. Received a \$5000 grant from West Central Electric for new nonfiction and flexible seating. Clean and repair books as needed, order books and supplies to make sure library needs are met. Services we offer include: collaborate with teachers, provide checkouts to students, laminator services, tech requests, request books for staff, and solves problems with copier.

#### Collaboration With Other Librarians

Robin Eissler is Abby Weber's mentor and they meet monthly. Carla House joins them for quarterly meetings. Abby has great ideas and works hard to keep up to date on library issues. Carla is a wealth of information for us. Carla and Abby helped Robin with recommendations for audio books. We discuss library policies and share ideas with each other.

Abby was able to attend the MASL conference last spring and attended workshops. She mostly went to workshops that pertained to the high school. There were a couple that stood out. One of the librarians talked about how she started combining some of the nonfiction books with her fiction and circulation has gone up for those nonfiction books. An example would be to put true crime in with the mysteries. Another workshop that stood out was Epsilon Beta which means Keepers of the Library. It is a club for students in which they will help promote literacy throughout the school. There are leadership opportunities as well as scholarship opportunities.

This spring Abby Weber, Miss Connie and Robin Eissler will all be attending the spring MASL conference to learn new strategies and collaborate with other librarians.

Add more STEAM related items to the makerspace. Replace carpet due to water damage. Add a display table for new books.
