5. Must sign own given name (first name or first initial and last name). **No individual may sign for another individual.**
6. Petition shall be returned to City Clerk's Office or the Parks & Recreation Office to forward to Parks & Recreation Advisory Board (PRAB) for consideration.
7. Twenty-five (25) signatures must appear on the Petition.
8. If suggested name approved by PRAB, public notice shall be made, with public invited to next scheduled PRAB Meeting for discussion of name submitted.

Norm and Jan Pawlowski have been committed to education, recreation, business, and civic responsibility since moving to Brighton in 1967. Norm, a Marine Corps veteran, counselled at BHS for 30 years, coached boys basketball, girls tennis, girls golf, and served as the boys golf coach for 40 years!

Jan chaired Parks & Recreation Board advocating for both youth and adult sports leagues, the development of many parks and the Brighton Recreation Center. She served as president of the adult softball league and Norm was the on-site supervisor for several years. On city council, Jan was instrumental the development of the youth sports complex as well as the adult softball fields. In 2001, Jan was elected as Brighton's 1<sup>st</sup> female Mayor, making Norm the 1<sup>st</sup> first man.

Together, they owned Varsity Sporting Goods more than 30 years, providing local schools and teams with uniforms, trophies, embroidery, letter jackets, and supporting the High School DECA program.

The Brighton Youth Sports Complex is currently owned by 27J and managed and maintained by the City of Brighton, this would be the perfect complement to the Pawlowski's commitment to education and local government. It would be a great honor to have the Brighton Youth Sports Complex renamed "Pawlowski Park – Youth Sports Complex" in recognition of their dedication and service to the community.
