# **OHS/OTC College Now Program Policies & Checklist**

### **Eligibility:**

Juniors and seniors at OHS with a 3.0 GPA may take up to two approved OTC classes per semester. Students who have earned an F in previous OTC class are not eligible for classes the following semester.

### **Attendance Policy:**

OTC can administratively withdraw you from a course due to non-participation. You must attend class and communicate regularly with your instructor.

### **Grades:**

All grades earned (including F's) at OTC will be reflected on the student's OHS transcript. In addition, withdrawing or being dropped from a class after the first week of OTC classes will also result in an F on the OHS transcript.

### **Payment:**

You will be liable to pay for the class(es) and your OHS student account will be charged for the following situations at the end of the semester:

- Failing a course
- Dropping a course after the first week of OTC classes
- Being administratively withdrawn due to attendance

\*\* To drop an OTC class before the semester begins, you **MUST** fill out a College Now drop form from the OHS Counseling Office. Failing to attend class does **NOT** constitute an official withdrawal and **WILL** result in you being administratively withdrawn and course fees charged to your account.
