We are pleased to present you with the Annual Education Report (AER), which provides key information on the 2022-23 educational progress for Chestnut Hill Elementary. For the 2022-23 school year, schools were identified based on previous years' performance using definitions and labels as required in the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). A Targeted Support and Improvement (TSI) school is one that had at least one underperforming student subgroup in 2022-23. An Additional Targeted Support (ATS) school is one that had a student subgroup performing at the same level as the lowest 5% of all schools in the state in 2022-23. A Comprehensive Support and Improvement (CSI) school is one whose performance was in the lowest 5% of all schools in the state or had a graduation rate at or below 67% in 2022-23. Some schools are not identified with any of these labels. In these cases, no label is given.

Our school was not given one of these labels.

The key challenge for our school is helping students that may have experienced learning loss. We also continue to work on narrowing the achievement gap across all of the tested subjects (mathematics, reading, science, social studies and writing), as well as increasing the Student Growth Percentile for every student.

We continue to emphasize The International Baccalaureate (IB) Primary Years Program (PYP). After a successful evaluation process in 2021, we are working on the recommended program improvements. The Next Generation Science Standards, Project Lead The Way, community presentations and student/class actions are being included in unit planners. The solid foundation that the IB PYP provides helps us to achieve the Midland Public Schools' Vision and Chestnut Hill Elementary Schools' Mission Statements for our students.
