CINCINNATI PUBLIC SCHOOLS

A RESOLUTION OPPOSING THE RESTRUCTURING OF THE STATE BOARD OF EDUCATION AND THE OHIO DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION

WHEREAS, the Cincinnati City School District Board of Education affirms the notion that public education should be a non-partisan environment; and

WHEREAS, the Board values a public education system that is accountable to the citizens and communities it serves; and

WHEREAS, the Board believes that students do best when families work with trained educators and elected school board members to determine the scope and nature of education in their districts; and

WHEREAS, the Board recognizes that Senate Bill 178 strips the State Board of significant educational responsibilities; and

WHEREAS, the Board views Senate Bill 178 as dramatically changing the face of public education by shifting oversight of public education from the voters and the State Board of Education to the governor's office; and

WHEREAS, the Board believes that any bill that reshapes how public education operates in the state of Ohio, should be thoroughly researched, discussed, and debated by education stakeholders, voters, and taxpayers; and

WHEREAS, the Board is very concerned at the expedited manner in which this bill is being progressed through a lame-duck session of the General Assembly;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, the Board urges lawmakers to stop SB178 as a bill, and/or as an amendment to any other legislation and recommends that Ohio lawmakers reintroduce the bill in the next General Assembly to allow for transparency and accountability through appropriate review and deliberation amongst all stakeholders.

CINCINNATI PUBLIC SCHOOLS

A RESOLUTION OPPOSING THE STATE BOARD OF EDUCATION'S RESOLUTION TO OPPOSE PROPOSED CHANGES TO TITLE IX

WHEREAS, the Cincinnati City School District Board of Education prohibits discrimination on the basis of sex, sexual orientation, gender, gender identity or expression, and other protected characteristics. *See* CPS Board Policy 2260 Nondiscrimination and Access to Equal Educational Opportunity; and

WHEREAS, Cincinnati Public Schools has consistently opposed discrimination against transgender students and staff – regardless of the shifting positions of the U.S. and Ohio Departments of Education; and

WHEREAS, the Ohio State Board of Education has a duty to protect all students from discrimination, bullying, harassment, and to enable all students to participate fully in the educational program and activities offered by public school districts; and

WHEREAS, the resolution recently-introduced in the State Board to oppose Title IX's application to transgender children is a dereliction of the State Board's duty to protect children and creates an unsafe learning environment for some of Ohio's most vulnerable children; and

WHEREAS, the resolution perpetuates falsehoods and stereotypes about gender identity and expression; and

WHEREAS, the resolution misrepresents current legal status of Title IX protections and responsibilities of school districts and could cause school districts who follow the State Board's guidance to jeopardize critical federal funding for their districts;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, the Board urges the State Board of Education to reject the proposed resolution and to stop further efforts to discriminate against Ohio school children on the basis of sex, sexual orientation, gender, gender identity or expression, and other protected characteristics.
