CINCINNATI PUBLIC SCHOOLS

A RESOLUTION OPPOSING OHIO SENATE BILL 1

WHEREAS, the Cincinnati City School District Board of Education believes that public education should be overseen by a non-partisan and non-political department of education;

WHEREAS, the Board believes that the public education system should be accountable to the citizens and communities it serves; and

WHEREAS, local elected officials are in the best position to determine the scope and nature of education in their school districts:

WHEREAS, Ohio Senate Bill 1 strips the Ohio State Board of Education of significant educational responsibilities and deprives students and families of a public education system that is accountable to local representatives; and

WHEREAS, Senate Bill 1 dramatically shifts oversight of public education from the State Board of Education and to the partisan executive branch of Ohio's government; and

WHEREAS, the Board believes that any bill that so dramatically reshapes the public education system in Ohio should be thoroughly researched, discussed, and debated by education stakeholders, voters, and taxpayers;

WHEREAS, the Board is unaware of any efforts that lawmakers have made to get input from local boards of education about this important legislation;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, the Board of Education opposes Senate Bill 1 and urges lawmakers to vote against this legislation. While the Board of Education agrees that there could be much improvement to the Ohio Department of Education, the General Assembly should take more time for input, dialogue, and conversation before proceeding with such dramatic changes to the public education system in Ohio.

WHEREAS, the Board of Education of the Cincinnati City School District (the "Board") and the Cincinnati Chamber Orchestra ("CCO") continue to work in partnership in bringing Arts to the Community; and

WHEREAS, the CCO will use the facilities of the School for the Creative and Performing Arts from August 5, 2023 through August 26, 2023 for their Summermusik Festival season, with specific performances as follows:

Saturday, August 5, 2023

Saturday, August 19, 2023

Saturday, August 26, 2023; and

WHEREAS, the CCO is requesting a waiver to serve alcohol at these performances.
