## SUPERINTENDENT'S UPDATE

**Superintendent Wright: Ms. Wright** updated the Board and Public that Transportation is an on-going work in progress. **Ms. Wright** and her team will continue to work towards perfection regarding transportation. **Ms. Wright** and the transportation team are working with Families to see which students are utilizing bus services. Notices have been sent out to see what the families preferences are and the transportation team is following up to see if the forms were filled out correctly. **Ms. Wright** and her team's goal is to provide clarification for all parties involved. There are still about 8 routes that they're working on. **Ms. Wright** advised the public to utilize the call-center so that all the issues are addressed. The goal is efficiency. Right now the transportation team has improved and they're at about 84% again the goal is 100%.

### HEARING OF THE PUBLIC

**Sally Grimes (Executive Director** of **ABC)** – invited people to attend their three upcoming events. September 17<sup>th</sup> from 9a.m.-2p.m. free soccer clinic. October 5<sup>th</sup> CPS Athletics Hall of Fame induction ceremony at TQL Stadium. October 7<sup>th</sup> Advocate for Education day with the school board & other partners. Please see the information on abccincy.org. Ms. Grimes spoke about how the donations to ABC are distributed and utilized Ms. Grimes also spoke about the after school programs.

Julie Sellers (CFT/CFOP President) – Ms. Sellers spoke about the nursing shortage. She doesn't believe that the nursing contracts with The City of Cincinnati are working. Ms. Sellers spoke on the Ohio laws regarding nurses in school and non-medical staff administering medication. Ms. Sellers had a meeting with all the union leads from the district to discuss the issue regarding overload and the corrections that need to be made so that the students have minimal distractions in the classroom. Ms. Sellers also requested to the Board that there be some type of program created for our students who are dealing with trauma. Ms. Sellers shared with the Board and Superintendent that there was a grant received to support Woodward High School. CYC and the Resource Coordinators will be joining the efforts to figure out how to meet the needs of the students at Woodward High School. The goal is to stabilize the staffing and knock down some of the barriers at Woodward with the Grant.

# A RESOLUTION APPROVING STUDENTS ELIGIBLE FOR SUBSIDY (REIMBURSEMENT IN LIEU OF TRANSPORTATION)

#### FOR THE 2023-2024 SCHOOL YEAR

**WHEREAS**, the Cincinnati City School District has identified an additional fifty-one (51) pupils, bringing the total to eight hundred and forty-three (843), to be residents of this school district and eligible for transportation services; and

**WHEREAS,** after a careful evaluation of all available options, it has been determined that it is impractical to provide transportation for these students to their selected schools; and

**WHEREAS,** the following factors as identified in Ohio Revised Code 3327.02 have been considered on a student-by-student basis:

- 1. The time and distance required to provide the transportation
- 2. The number of pupils to be transported
- 3. The cost of providing transportation in terms of equipment, maintenance, personnel, and administration
- 4. Whether similar or equivalent service is provided to other pupils eligible for transportation
- 5. Whether and to what extent the additional service unavoidably disrupts current transportation schedules
- 6. Whether other reimbursable types of transportation are available; and

WHEREAS, the option of offering payment in lieu of transportation is provided in Ohio Revised Code;

**NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED,** that the Cincinnati Board of Education, in accordance with ORC 3327.2 and Board Policy 8600.02, declares an additional fifty-one (51) pupils, bringing the total to eight hundred and forty-three (843) pupils impractical for transportation; and

**BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED,** that the Cincinnati Board of Education approves the declaration of impractical to transport for the identified students for the 2023-2024 school year.
