SafetySafety (Ramos)We have begun to share concerns: fire safety near the preschool playground door, where 6-9 students need to wait for preschoolers to go out before they would be able to leave the building. All who monitor lunch should be trained on Heimlich maneuver.

Ms. Ferguson and the 6-9 teachers will be hosting a Testing Information Evening on 10/12, to talk to parents about upcoming OST and the school report card. 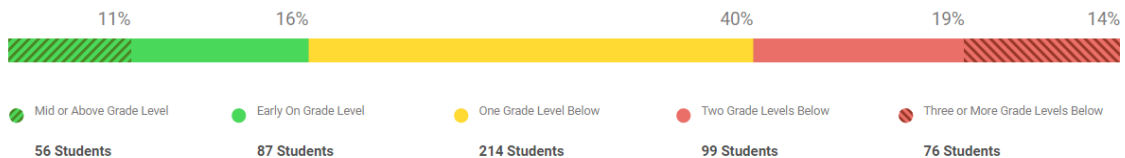

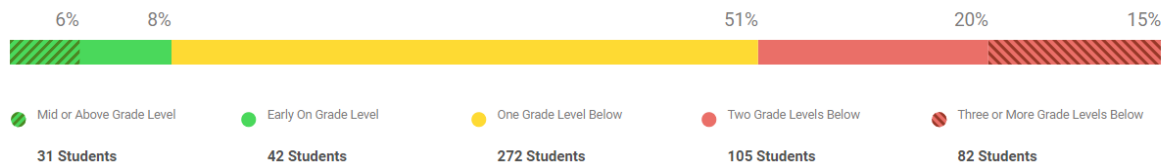
