A Moment in Black History: What is an HBCU?

An HBCU is "...any historically black college or university that was established prior to 1964, whose principal mission was, and is, the education of black Americans,...". HBCUs offer all students, regardless of race, an opportunity to develop their skills and talents. HBCUs are a source of accomplishment and great pride for the African American community as well as the entire nation. A few popular HBCU's are: Alabama A&M, Alabama State University, Clark Atlanta University, Fisk University, Grambling State University, Howard University, Morehouse College, Meharry Medical College, Selma University, Spelman College, Tennessee University, Tuskegee University, & Wilberforce University.
