# Student Survey Results

## Response and Results

- 1,919 Responses from Grades 9-12
- 74.7% Keep Current Schedule

## Outcome Beliefs

If the high school bell times were shifted to later in the day, students believed the following would occur:

- Positively impact their sleep and academic performance.
- Negatively impact their activity and work schedules.

# Family and Staff Survey Results

## Response and Results

- 3,709 Total Responses, 2,980 from Families, and 1,099 from Staff
- 75.5% Keep Current Schedule

- Parent Work Schedules
- Student Activity and Work Schedules
- Too Early for Elementary Students
