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BOARD OF EDUCATION MINUTES – REGULAR MEETING Tuesday, April 18 2023, at San Pasqual Union School

 Meeting called to order at 4:31 p.m.to allow public comment on closed session agenda items. Board Members Merz, Goe, Gourley and Murray were present. Member Baker not in attendance. Superintendent Burroughs and recording secretary Jenny Grassy were also present. No one addressed the Board. Adjournment at 4:32 p.m. for closed session.

Regular Session

- Meeting reconvened at 6:19 p.m..
- Public was welcomed. The flag salute was recited.
- Report from closed session: In closed session, the Board retained and directed legal
 counsel to initiate legal action (social media litigation), by a vote of 4 to 0. Members
 Merz, Goe, Gourley and Murray approved a legal services agreement with Frantz Law
 Group for purposes of Social Media Litigation.
- Hearing of the Public: No one addressed the Board
- Member Murray motioned to approve the current agenda and minutes from the 03/14/2022 regular meeting. Member Gourley seconded the motion. Member Murray requested Consent Item S be moved out of consent to an Action/Discussion item. Motion passed 4/0 with aforementioned change.
- Middle School ELA teachers Mr. Timpe and Mr. Mizel gave a presentation on the middle school writing program (see website for presentation)
- Mr. Burroughs presented the LCAP survey results which included student, staff, and parent feedback on academic programming, student wellness, safety, and parent engagement. Board discussed troubling trends with student mental health, including increased rates of sadness and suicidal ideations among youth. School shutdowns, isolation, and social media are viewed as contributing factors. School will continue to support students via counselor and school social worker. Also planning a campaign to restrict cell phones and social media access while at school.
