Community Feedback on School-Based Health Center

In Spring 2017, Kids First Health Care received a school-based health center (SBHC) Planning Grant, in partnership with 27J, from the Colorado Department of Public Health and Environment.

We surveyed BHS students, parents, and staff about top health concerns, barriers to health care access, and interest in a SBHC.

What's the SBHC?

A School-Based Health Center (SBHC) is a medical clinic for students located on school grounds. It's a medical office in your school! SBHCs support student success by reducing the time students spend dealing with medical issues instead of being in class.
