You are committed to your students' intellectual and moral growth, and so you understand that it is important for students to make the right choices when it comes to their college educations.

The Lyceum Scholars Program at Clemson University offers an education aimed at shaping students' minds and characters, all while providing the benefits of a small liberal arts community within a large research university.

We believe that ideas are enduring, and so the Lyceum Scholars Program, first and foremost, studies ideas. The Lyceum Scholars Program uses a Great Books approach to studying the moral, political, and economic foundations of a free society. More specifically, Lyceum Scholars take a series of eight classes over their undergraduate careers, with course topics that range from the political thought of the American founding to ancient political thought to constitutional law.

We believe teaching matters, and we believe there is a connection between moral character and a free society. To this end, Lyceum Scholars meet with Socratic Tutors (i.e., faculty mentors) biweekly to discuss moral character and the application of theory to practice, applying the ideas they learn in the classroom to their own lives.

The Lyceum Scholars Program is now accepting applications for Fall 2020. **Students accepted into the program receive \$10,000 scholarships to Clemson University.** The priority application deadline is **December 11, 2019**.




