 85% "OK", "Good", or "Great"
 95% DON'T want to resume fulltime distance learning

Providing School Meals

SPU NOT eligible for Seamless Summer Option (SSO) feeding program Referred to 8 feeding stations in Escondido, closest within a mile of District boundaries Referred families to Pandemic EBT program Hosted drive-thru food drive
