BP/AR 5132 - Dress and Grooming

Goals of the Dress Code:

- Maintain a safe learning environment
- Promote a body-positive image where students are not to be marginalized based on race, class, gender, sexual orientation, or other identify markers
- Allow students to wear clothing of their choice that is comfortable.

BP/AR 5132 - Dress and Grooming

Students MUST Wear:	Students MAY Wear:	Students CANNOT Wear:
Shirt.Bottom.Shoes.	 Hats/hoods outside. Fitted pants. Tank Tops. Athletic Jersey tops. 	 Violent images. Images depicting substance abuse. Hate speech or profanity. Images or language that creates a hostile or intimidating environment on any protected class. Visible underwear.

BP/AR 5132 - Dress and Grooming

Allowable Dress & Grooming

- 1. Students must wear clothing including both a shirt, bottoms (pants, skirts, shorts, or equivalent), and shoes.
- 2. Clothing must be sufficient to cover undergarments. See-through tops and bare abdomens are prohibited.
- 3. Students in preschool through fifth grade must wear closed-toed shoes.
- 4. Students in middle school may wear open-toed shoes on non-PE days.
- 5. Hats and other headwear must allow the face to be visible and not interfere with the line of sight to any student or staff. Hoodies must allow the student's face to be visible to staff.

Non-Allowable Dress & Grooming

- 1. Students may NOT wear clothing denoting gang affiliation (EC 35183).
- 2. Clothing and accessories that advertises, promotes, or glamorizes drugs, alcohol or tobacco products, displays foul or sexually suggestive language or symbols, or denotes weapons or other means of violence, are not permitted.

BP 4020.1 Professional Adult/Student Boundaries

- PURPOSE: Provide all staff, students, volunteers, and community members with information to increase their awareness of their role in protecting children from inappropriate conduct.
- WHO: All adults are expected to maintain professional, moral, and ethical relationships with students that are conducive to an effective, safe learning environment.


