


What is an LCAP?






LCAP Goal 1. Increase academic achievement through quality instruction and technology integration in a broad course of student delivered by highly qualified teachers on a safe, clean, and well maintained school campus.

LCAP Goal 2. Increase academic achievement through targeted support, intervention, and enrichment for all students including Special Education, English Learners, Foster Youth, and Low Income students using data derived from multiple assessments to measure student progress, guide instruction, and improve professional practice.

District Focus Goal - <u>LCAP Goal 2.b.</u>
SBAC scores for all students will increase by 5% in both ELA and Math (as measured by assessment data).

Early signs are positive. . .

- NWEA MAPs: Fall '18 to Winter '19
 - o ELA
 - All grades 3-8 (except 7th) met or exceeded growth projections (most growth in 6th grade)
 - Math
 - All grades met or exceeded growth projections (most growth in 7th grade)

LCAP Goal 3. Increase academic achievement and <u>school climate</u> through student, staff, parent, and community engagement, involvement, and connectedness within the school environment.

- PARENTS- Feel connected, but still fine tuning balance of events and instructional objectives
 - O 100% parents and 94% of staff agree/strongly agree school welcomes parent involvement*
- STUDENTS Meeting exceeding academic targets but need more student engagement
 - 48% of 7th graders report doing things at school that make a difference*
 - 14% of 5th graders report they are asked what they want to learn about*
- COMMUNITY Continue to build partnerships with SD Zoo Safari Park, local law enforcement, & others
