#### Why is it called Bridges Preparatory Charter School?

- It is called **Bridges** because our Goals are to:
  - bridge the opportunity gap for underserved learners,
  - **bridge** the instructional gap between traditional and virtual learning,
  - bridge the collaboration gap that exists between public and charter schools, and
  - bridge the funding gap for San Pasqual Union School District.

- #1-Bridge the "opportunity gap" that exists for traditionally underserved students, placing the focus on giving those students opportunities to succeed.
  - There are issues in our current school system and in our collective mindset that create barriers for some students.
  - Only 26% of SD County 7th graders will complete post-secondary education (NCES).
  - Nearly 30,000 7th graders will fail on their way through high school and on to college.

- #2- Bridge the gap between traditional direct instruction and virtual instruction.
  - Students will have the opportunity to define their own path of learning, whether it is in the traditional brick-and-mortar school, in an online environment, or a mix of both.
  - Blended learning is complex, but at Bridges it will simply be a method of instruction that can change according to the unique needs of learners.
  - Students will learn in part at a supervised brick-and-mortar location as well as through online delivery with an element of student control over time, place, path, and/or pace.

- #3- Bridge the support students need from a variety of organizations & agencies, i.e. public schools, after-school programs, youth services, & higher education so college is attainable for all.
  - Bridges will work collaboratively and seamlessly with the local public schools sharing and integrating data across a network of partners to achieve our goals.
  - This is a family business and traditional public schools are vital members of our family.

- #4- Bridge SPUSD funding gap created by the new state funding formula.
  - Districts with the highest concentrations of poor students receive more funding than other districts.
  - Although revenue increased, districts use it to plug budget holes for healthcare and pension costs.
  - Community fundraising can only do so much; it is time to think out of the box and use your most valuable assets.
