Closed Session (4:00)

 Board reported that they conducted deliberation regarding the previous interviews for Superintendent / Principal position.

Regular Session

- Regular meeting called to order at 5:35 p.m. All members present. Superintendent Hargrave and recording secretary, Pamela Hansen were also present
- Public was welcomed and the flag salute was recited
- Director of Finance asked for approval on a resolution: Cooperative Strategies performed a Residential and Commercial/Industrial Development School Fee justification study for San Pasqual Union School District. This studies confirms San Pasqual's ability to increase the developer fees collected to the new rates that we approved by the State Allocation Board (SAB) on January 27, 2018.
- Public Hearing: Two people spoke in favor of Mr. Burroughs getting the Superintendent job, Matt Zdunich and Stephanie Jones
- Member Jackson made a motion to move Item K in the Consent Agenda to Open Session as C1. Member Hersey made a motion to approve the move and Member Spivey seconded the motion. Motion passed 5/0.
- Member Heidemann made a motion to approve the agenda with changes and minutes from the 3/13/18 meeting. Member Hersey seconded the motion. Motion passed 4/0
- Teacher, Nicole Zdunich gave a curriculum presentation about the 5th grade trip to Biz Town (Available on the SPU website)
- Superintendent Hargrave gave an update on LCAP Teacher Input (Available on the SPU website)

Superintendent Report

- Kinder fence slats for safety \$3400 (per safety committee)
- Garden snake fence for safety \$5000
- Stage curtains cleaning and fireproofing \$2700
- Mike Knight will be helping Ray Sifuentes with preparing baseball field
- Technology plan will be shared in a Google Doc
- Julie Romero being recognized as a 'biliteracy leader' by the Leadership in Biliteracy Symposium. The ceremony is May 8.
- We are aware of the Safari Highlands Development and understand that a portion of that development is projected to be constructed within the boundaries of SPUSD. Because this

project is still in the planning process, we haven't included it yet in the justification study. The good news is that when it is approved, we can update the fee studies to reflect the newest information. There is nothing that precludes us from updating the fee study at any given point, we try to match the report update with the State Allocation Board (SAB) action to get the fees in place ASAP. So once the project is approved, we can quickly update the fee studies to make the reports as accurate as possible.

• Assistant Principal, Mark Burroughs, Attended 3 meetings of the Escondido Community Safety Meeting. Led by Chief Carter, EPD. Discussions centered on campus preparedness (i.e., fences and cameras), school resources officers, and a common message from local school leaders. Most recent meeting was our press conference yesterday, April 9 from EPD Headquarters.

The Declaration of Need (DON) is the annual form submitted to the California Commission on Teacher Credentialing (CCTC) by county offices of education, public school districts, state-wide agencies or non-public schools or agencies. This form contains the employing agency's estimated (it is acceptable to overestimate with no penalty) the number of Emergency Permits (such as Emergency CLADs and BCLADs), Limited Assignments, and Internship Credentials that will be requested during the school year.

The CCTC must have a current DON on file **prior to** processing applications for the Emergency and Limited Assignment Permits. The DON will be valid for twelve months and will expire on June 30, 2019.

The DON must be presented in its entirety to the governing board at a regularly scheduled public meeting of that board. It may **NOT** be presented as part of a <u>consent calendar</u>.

Once the DON has been approved by the board, the cover page must be signed and completed by the individual, the board, or superintendent designee, such as the board's secretary, the personnel director, or the credentials specialist. The original completed Declaration of Need board agenda item, along with the supporting material that was presented to the board, must be sent by <u>June 17, 2018</u>, to the SDCOE (<u>do not send direct to CTC</u>). If the DON is incomplete or the supporting materials are not submitted, the DON will be returned to your district office for the additional information or documentation.

Please use the current Declaration of Need (12/2016) form (see attachment) approved by the CCTC as it is to be used for the school year 2018-2019.

AUTHORIZING EDUCATION PROTECTION ACCOUNT

On a motion by Member	, seconded by Member	
the following Resolution is adopted:		

WHEREAS, the voters approved temporary sales and income tax increases with Proposition 30 on November 6, 2012; and voters approved Proposition 55 on November 8, 2016 which allowed the sales tax increase to expire in 2016 while extending the increased income tax rates through 2030.

WHEREAS, Proposition 30 added Article XIII, Section 36 to the California Constitution effective November 7, 2012; and Proposition 55 amended Article XIII, Section 36 of the California Constitution effective November 8, 2016 and commencing on January 1, 2018.

WHEREAS, the provisions of Article XIII, Section 36(e) create in the state General Fund an Education Protection Account to receive and disburse the revenues derived from the incremental increases in taxes imposed by Article XIII, Section 36(f);

WHEREAS, before June 30th of each year, the Director of Finance shall estimate the total amount of additional revenues, less refunds that will be derived from the incremental increases in tax rates made pursuant to Article XIII, Section 36(f) that will be available for transfer into the Education Protection Account during the next fiscal year;

WHEREAS, if the sum determined by the State Controller is positive, the State Controller shall transfer the amount calculated into the Education Protection Account within ten days preceding the end of the fiscal year;

WHEREAS, all monies in the Education Protection Account are hereby continuously appropriated for the support of school districts, county offices of education, charter schools and community college districts;

WHEREAS, monies deposited in the Education Protection Account shall not be used to pay any costs incurred by the Legislature, the Governor or any agency of state government;

WHEREAS, a community college district, county office of education, school district, or charter school shall have the sole authority to determine how the monies received from the Education Protection Account are spent in the school or schools within its jurisdiction;

WHEREAS, the governing board of the district shall make the spending determinations with respect to monies received from the Education Protection Account in open session of a public meeting of the governing board;

WHEREAS, the monies received from the Education Protection Account shall not be used for salaries or benefits for administrators or any other administrative cost;

WHEREAS, each community college district, county office of education, school district and charter school shall annually publish on its Internet website an accounting of how much money was received from the Education Protection Account and how that money was spent;

WHEREAS, the annual independent financial and compliance audit required of community college districts, county offices of education, school districts and charter schools shall ascertain and verify whether the funds provided from the Education Protection Account have been properly disbursed and expended as required by Article XIII, Section 36 of the California Constitution;

WHEREAS, expenses incurred by community college districts, county offices of education, school districts and charter schools to comply with the additional audit requirements of Article XIII, Section 36 may be paid with funding from the Education Protection Act and shall not be considered administrative costs for purposes of Article XIII, Section 36.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, by the Governing Board of the San Pasqual Union School District of San Diego County of California, that the monies received from the Education Protection Account shall be spent as required by Article XIII, Section 36 and the spending determinations on how the money will be spent shall be made in open session of a public meeting of the governing board.

In compliance with Article XIII, Section 36(e), with the California Constitution, the governing board of the San Pasqual Union School District has determined to spend the monies received from the Education Protection Act as attached.
