THE FIRST SUNDAY OF LENT FEBRUARY 18, 2024

From Fr. Eric: Forty-day Journey to Victory (Mark 1:15)

On the first Sunday of our forty-day Lenten journey, the Gospel Reading speaks of the forty days of Jesus in the desert. The reason for this period in the desert is given by Mark in his text – it was for Jesus to be tempted by Satan. Mark points out that the power behind the move of Jesus into the desert was the Spirit. The force of the sentence shows that the initiative was not from Jesus himself. The Spirit that came upon him at his baptism now took control of him and drove him to the desert. The use of the verb “to drive” (“*na odigeíte*” in the Greek text) shows the divine urgency of the action that is to be undertaken. The Spirit drives Jesus into the desert or the wilderness which with its variety of meanings in the Old Testament seems to play not only a physical but also a figurative role in the narrative. In general, the desert is a place of ambiguity in Scripture. It was for Israel a place of refuge away from any form of aggression. It was a place of encounter with God but also a place of trial, temptation and sin.

The number of days Jesus spent in the desert is equally of symbolic significance in the narrative. We know of other uses of the number forty in the Scriptures, particularly in the Old Testament. The number forty recalls the experiences of Moses in Exodus 24,18 and Elijah in 1Kings 19:4-8,15. We also think of the forty years of Israel in the desert on the way to the Promised Land (Ex 34:28).

In the Gospel Reading, Mark also mentions that Jesus was fed by angels. This is a way of indicating how God provides for those he takes into his care. Jesus did not have to worry about his sustenance because God was providing for him by means of the angels. All he needed to do was to concentrate on his encounter with Satan and come out victorious.

The Spirit drives Jesus into the desert to be tempted by Satan. Although Jesus is the one being tempted, it is clear that the two forces that seek dominance over him are the Spirit and Satan. Jesus who had received the confirmation of his Sonship and is full of the Spirit would now have to confront an opposing force and prove himself before God and humanity that he is faithful to the Father who entrusted him with the mission of salvation. Mark narrates the temptation in only two verses and so does not describe the specific temptations nor speak of the victory of Jesus over Satan. Mark leaves us to conclude for ourselves that Jesus was victorious because he goes on to proclaim the Good News from God.

Mark has a distinctive element in his narrative that calls for particular attention. It is the mention of wild beasts which we do not find in the accounts of Matthew and Luke. On the one hand, the reference to wild beasts reinforces the savagery of the wilderness where the encounter took place. In the Scriptures, wild beasts normally go together with the forces of evil. Satan, not being an agent of God, falls under the forces of evil and his activities against Jesus are reinforced by the presence of wild beasts. This implies that Jesus needed protection from them as he struggled against the temptations of Satan. The mention of angels being with Jesus attenuates the force of the savagery associated with wild beasts. It gives the impression that Jesus was living peacefully with the wild beasts because the Father was with him.

The story of the temptation of Jesus places before us the struggles we may have to go through during our forty days of Lenten journey. As we intensify our spiritual or prayer life, we risk becoming more conscious of the machinations of the evil one. **Just as Jesus was tempted by Satan and came out victorious**, we are encouraged to undergo our Lenten journey in a way that **we can come out victorious**. It is important we keep in mind that **we should not venture out on our own without the Holy Spirit's direction or guidance**. While travelling in this desert world, especially during this Lenten Season, we would be battling spiritual forces of different kinds **but we should trust that God would protect us with his angels**.

We pray for the grace to come out victorious so that we can bear witness to Jesus who saved us by shedding his blood for us.
