

Confidentiality

Any person working for or providing services to the District has a responsibility to protect the privacy of students and their parents. This responsibility applies to time spent at school as well as away from school. Questions from the general public concerning students or staff should be referred to an administrator.

Federal Requirements

District employees and service providers must follow confidentiality requirements under the Family Education Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA), Pupil Protection and Rights Amendment (PPRA), Children's Online Privacy Protection Act (COPPA), Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA), and the Richard B. Russell National School Lunch Act (NSLA) and the Child Nutrition Act (CNA).

Information Release

Information concerning students shall only be released in accordance with the district's policy on student education records and privacy. Information concerning district employees, activities, and operations shall be released in accordance with district policy and state law.

Children's free and reduced price meal information obtained under provisions of the NSLA or CNA by the determining official, Nutrition Services, is confidential information. Disclosure of students' eligibility will comply with provisions authorizing the limited disclosure of students' eligibility information to specified programs or individuals under certain parameters and by obtaining required parent/guardian consent. The form included in this policy shall be used by programs or individuals to request parental/guardian consent to obtain eligibility information.

Violations

Employees that violate this policy may be subject to disciplinary action up to and including dismissal in accordance with law and district policy.
