





The 2015 budget year was better for us than the past several years have been. Our legislators have listened, taken action, and restored a large percentage of the funding that we have been shorted through the Gap Elimination Adjustment (GEA) over the past five years. This restoration enables us to place less reliance on reserve funds to balance the budget, begin to build back some of the reserve funds that we have used to do just that, while building back and adding new programs. Unfortunately, the news is not all good as we are still being shorted nearly \$400,000.00 of state aid that is due to us. In summary, we are grateful for the restoration in aid that we have received and are hopeful that the trend will continue in the right direction.

The new year will bring many new and exciting supports and programs to our district; there will be much needed additional support for Academic Intervention Services (AIS), additional mental health support, additional support for art and music, and a position at the high school to develop our new Pathways program. Additionally, we will have full time Assistant Principal/Instructional Coaches at each of the buildings. The “law of life” is bringing about some very positive and exciting changes for Williamson Central.

I would like to publicly thank our Board of Education and in particular Patrick “Pete” Wright for his years of service on the Board, Michael Collins for taking on the role of President for another year, Caroline Jackson for being elected to the position of Vice-President of the Board, and to Monica Fernaays for being elected as trustee by her community.
