The coaches are trained by the district level coaches to analyze data. They routinely analyze all data and target collaboration meeting focus areas based on the data.

The principal held informational meetings to address parents' questions and concerns such as coffee with the principal.

SSC is open to all parents to attend and have input. However, all decisions are made by the SSC members after considering the input of all stakeholders.

The school engages Title I, Part A parents in meaningful interactions with the school. The Compact supports a partnership among staff, parents, and the community to improve student academic achievement. To help reach these goals, the school has established the following practices:

Flyers, digital marquee, website, weekly parent newsletter, email, texts and all-calls are sent out to inform parents of these meetings.

CAASPP and ELPAC parent portal meetings are offered in the fall for two sessions.

The school provides Title I, Part A parents with materials and training to help them work with their children to improve their children's achievement (ESSA Section 1116[e][2]).
