November 8, 2022 Referendum

The Board of Education of Community Consolidated School District 15 has unanimously adopted a resolution to place a bond referendum on the November 8, 2022 ballot.











Shall the Board of Education of Palatine Community Consolidated School District 15, Cook County, Illinois, alter, repair and equip existing buildings and construct and equip building additions, including but not limited to improving safety and security, replacing roofs, plumbing and HVAC systems, installing energy-efficiency improvements and certain Americans with Disabilities Act compliance measures, updating classrooms, science labs, libraries, and instructional technology, and constructing improvements to establish middle schools and provide full-day kindergarten, improve sites and issue bonds of said School District to the amount of \$93,000,000 for the purpose of paying the costs thereof?

To Our District 15 Community:

The Board of Education of Community Consolidated School District 15 has unanimously adopted a resolution to place a bond referendum on the November 8, 2022 election ballot.

The Moving 15 Forward plan is designed to benefit every student, school, and community.

Funds from the referendum will be used to repair and restore the District's 20 aging school buildings, which encompass more than 1.7 million square feet of space across seven communities. It will also update learning spaces and improve student transitions.



REFERENDUM HIGHLIGHTS:

- District 15 has planned for every student, school, and community to benefit
- > Voter-approved referendum would fund repairs and/or renovations to all 20 school buildings
- > Proposed improvements include:
- Upgrading safety and security
- · Replacing outdated roofing, plumbing, and mechanical systems
- Updating HVAC to improve air quality, air flow, and efficiency
- · Improving outdated classrooms, science labs/STEM spaces, and libraries

THE BOTTOM LINE:

- > It's been 34 years since District 15 voters approved funding for capital improvements
- > 50% of total project costs paid with non-referendum dollars
- Estimated tax impact of \$93 million voter-approved bond referendum is \$12.16 per month for a home with a fair market value of \$300,000, or about \$146 per year

REASSESSMENT FACTS:

- > The recent reassessment does not increase the amount of money collected by District 15
- The reassessment does not increase the tax impact of the bond issue
