
## In a WORLD






The 1993-1994 school year brought more students to A.I.S. than ever before. More than 300 students were enrolled in grades 7-12 and they came from more than 45 countries. Six more classrooms were added to the fifth floor to provide the needed classroom space. A total of 44 highly qualified teachers provided instruction to secondary school students.

The secondary curriculun increased with the new enrollment numbers. Several new International Baccalaureate courses were offered and the number of students enrolled in I.B. courses increased dramatically. The Student Council, National Honor Society, Model United Nations, and several other student organizations, were quite active and productive. The sport program was developed to involve more students and to expand the schedules.

Looking at the entire program at A.I.S., this was a fabulous fourth year in the history of our school. Where in the world could you find another international school which came this far this fast?




# Senior Iftar




Science Lair








