*Courses marked with ** may only be taken one time while at WWMS*

Grade(s) Offered	Length	Course and Brief Description
6, 7, 8	Y	Band or Orchestra – Provides the opportunity to apply knowledge and skills learned in the elementary music curriculum by beginning or continuing to play an instrument
6, 7, 8	Y	Choir – Sing individually and with a group. Focus on sight-reading, and reading rhythms and music
6, 7, 8	S	**Exploring Music – Perform and create music, and learn to respond to music
6, 7, 8	S	6th/7th/8th Grade Art – Students will learn proper critique etiquette, and various 2D & 3D techniques
6, 7, 8	S	**Ceramics – Ceramics is an introductory course to ceramic hand-building techniques
6, 7, 8	S	**Computer Graphics – Computer Graphics is an introductory course on how technology has assisted artists throughout time. The course is based on Adobe CS software, primarily Photoshop and HTML5
6, 7, 8	S	**FACS (Family and Consumer Science) – Includes five units of study: Life and Careers, Financial Literacy, Nutrition and Wellness, Human Development, and Relationships.
6, 7, 8	S	PE-Elective (Spring Semester) – An additional semester of P.E.
7, 8	S	**Nutrition & Wellness - This is a nutrition class that introduces students to the basics of food preparation so they can become self-sufficient in accessing healthy and nutritious foods. This class is also valuable for students interested in careers related to nutrition, food, and wellness.
7, 8	S	**GTT (Gateway to Technology) – Gateway to Technology has students explore the topics of Design and Modeling, Computer Science, and Robotics
6, 7, 8	S	**Coding & Web Design – Data security, Data Gathering and Reporting, Computing Devices, Networks and Applications, Coding and Algorithms, and Building Websites
8	S	**Introduction to Computer Science (MHS Credit) – Students will learn the skills and processes needed to develop computer artifacts, basic coding– MUST HAVE TAKEN CODING & WEB DESIGN <i>High School Level Course for MHS Credit</i>
8	Y	**Engineering Essentials (MHS Credit) – Topics: Design Process, Experimental Design and Testing, CAD & Drafting, Geographic Information System (GIS), Systems Thinking, Project Management <i>High School Level Course for MHS Credit</i>
8	S	**PCC (MHS Credit) – Preparation for College and Career topics include: communication, leadership, and management processes; exploration of personal aptitudes; career exploration and planning; and building employment skills <i>High School Level Course for MHS Credit</i>
8	Y	**Spanish (MHS Credit) – High School Introduction Course in Spanish <i>High School Level Course for MHS Credit</i>
8	S	**Exploring World Languages – A one-semester course exploring the languages taught at MHS; 9 weeks of Spanish, 4 weeks of French, 4 weeks of American Sign Language, and a cultural project. <i>NOT for MHS Credit</i>
