5300.15	Student Rights and Responsibilities - Code of

All student interaction and communication among themselves, staff, and visitors on school property will be acceptable, civil and respectful.

Student Rights: The District is committed to safeguarding the rights given to all students under federal and state laws and district policy. In addition, to promote a safe, healthy, orderly and supportive school environment, all District students have the right to:

- 1. Take part in all District activities on an equal basis regardless of race, weight, color, creed, national origin, ethnic group, religion, religious practice, gender or sexual orientation or disability.
- 2. Present their version of the relevant events to the appropriate school personnel in connection with the imposition of the penalty.
- 3. Access school policies, regulations, rules and, when necessary, receive an explanation of those rules from school personnel.

Student Responsibilities: All District students have the responsibility to:

- 1. Contribute to maintaining a safe, supportive and orderly school environment that is conducive to learning and to show respect to other persons and to property.
- 2. Be familiar with and abide by District policies, rules and regulations dealing with student conduct.
- 3. Attend school every day unless they are legally excused and be in class, on time, and prepared to learn.
- 4. Work to the best of their ability in all academic and extracurricular pursuits and strive toward their highest level of achievement possible.
- 5. React to direction given by all school staff in a respectful, positive manner.

- 6. Using direct resources, work to develop mechanisms to manage their anger.
- 7. Ask questions when they do not understand.
- 8. Seek help in solving problems.
- 9. Dress appropriately for school and school functions.
- 10. Accept responsibility and be accountable for their actions.
- 11. Conduct themselves as representatives of the District when participating in or attending school-sponsored extracurricular events and to hold themselves to the highest standards of conduct, demeanor, and sportsmanship.
- 12. Report safety threats to appropriate school personnel or to an adult regardless of one's impression that they may be pranks or idle threats. For example, perceived acts of hazing, sexual harassment and intimidation.
