Graduation Requirements

- 40 hours of Community Service or Work-Based Learning (WBL)
- 2. Submit a Graduate Portfolio and Present a Graduate Defense
- 3. 5 Credits of Health
- 4. 5 Credits of Career Technical Education

Graduate Portfolio and Defense

The Graduate Portfolio and Defense is an opportunity for students to showcase their academic achievement and proficiency in the 4 C's (Critical Thinking, Creativity, Communication and Collaboration), and to reflect on and refine their learning and growth. The defense/project allows the student to communicate information and present effectively in multiple formats. Throughout their 4 years of high school, students will select their best work samples, complete a reflection for each piece, and upload/store in their portfolio.

Part I: Portfolio Content

- 1. **RESEARCH**, **as evidenced via Research paper (6-8 pages) -** evidence of student's critical thinking skills, use of evidence to support claims, and critical reading ability
- 2. **CREATIVITY, as evidenced via various student work -** student work that showcases creative/innovative solutions, processes and/or actual product
- 3. **WRITTEN COMMUNICATION, via Reflection paper (3-5 pages)** evidence of written communication skills, ability to reflect and assess growth and progress on items 1 and 2 above. This paper will also serve as the script for the oral presentation.

Portfolio and Defense Options:

A. Students may select a new topic during their senior year that incorporates all critical components of the portfolio content

OR

B. Select their best work from different class assignments throughout their high school years that meet the critical components of the portfolio content

Part II: Defense of Learning: Oral Communication Presentation

- A. **Sharing of portfolio** share 3 graded documents with panel of judges
- B. **Individual presentation** in front of panel of judges (8-10 minutes)
- C. **Use of technology** well-produced audio/visual aids or media
- D. **Question and answer session** (5 minutes) as demonstration of growth, reflection and self-evaluation

Subject	Description	Years
History/social science ("a")	Including one year of world history, cultures and historical geography and one year of U.S. history, or one-half year of U.S. history and one-half year of American government or civics.	2
English ("b")	College preparatory English that integrates reading of classic and modern literature, frequent and regular writing, and practice listening and speaking.	4
Mathematics ("c")	College-preparatory mathematics that include or integrate the topics covered in elementary and advanced algebra and two- and three-dimensional geometry.	3
Laboratory science ("d")	Laboratory science providing fundamental knowledge in at least two of the three disciplines of biology, chemistry and physics.	2
Language other than English ("e")	The same language other than English or equivalent to the second level of high school instruction.	2
Visual and performing arts ("f")	Chosen from dance, music, theater or the visual arts.	1
College-preparatory elective ("g")	From the "a-f" courses beyond those used to satisfy the requirements above, or courses that have been approved solely in the elective area.	1

Academic Considerations

- The higher your grades, the more opportunities you have.
 - "D" will earn graduation credit
 - > "C" minimum grade requirement for 4 year university
- Take Honors & AP courses in preparation for college.
 - › Grades, Teacher Recommendation, Test Scores
 - › Nearly all academic courses are A-G approved
- If you fail a class you don't receive credit for that class and you must reclaim that credit in a summer reclamation option.
 - See your counselor in March/April for Summer options.
 Summer School is limited so turn in applications early.
