Table allocation: each country will be assigned 1 table (1.4 m long) to decorate & 2 chairs allocated per table.

Placement: around the perimeter of the Football field. If your country offers live cooking and this request is approved, your table will be outside the MPH in a designated area.

A map of the table allocation will be sent to the Country Members 1 week prior and available on the day.

 - keep it simple

Interactive Stall Display

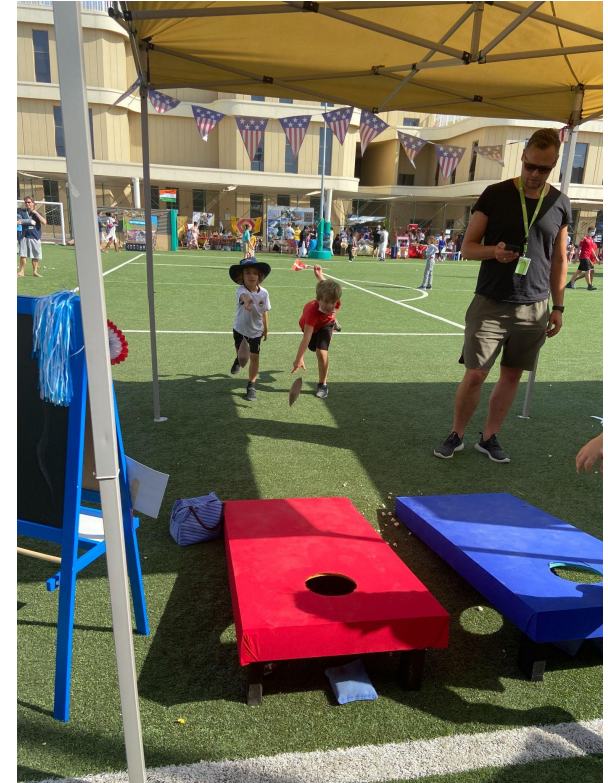
Games: Offering a game(s) is optional, area in front of your table can be used for set up

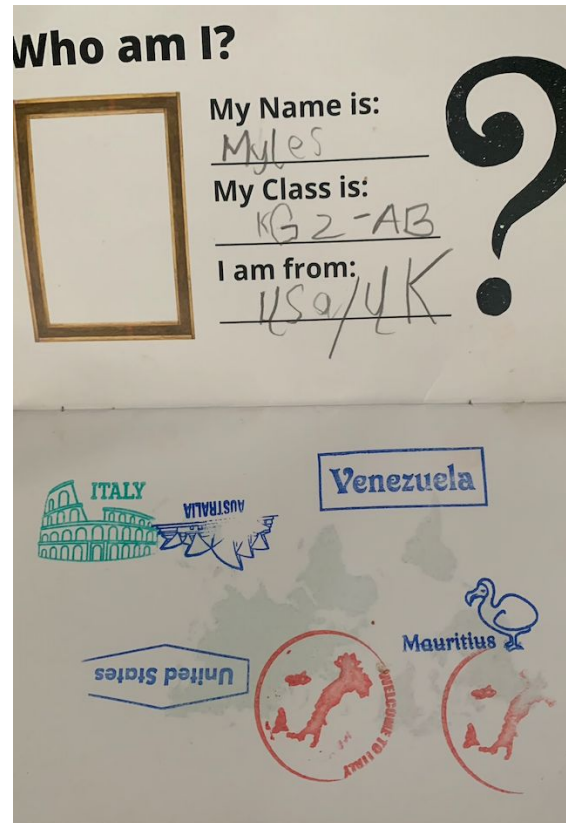
Examples - Lego from Denmark, Football from Brazil, Cornhole from USA

Best practices and sustainability guidelines

Food preparation:

- Food can be either home cooked or catered/store bought
- Please ensure that food is fresh and can be left at room temperature
- Wherever possible, please avoid individually wrapped/package food, instead please serve in a large covered dish
- Food items must be finger food that is bite-sized or pre-cut into bite sized portions
- Allergens must be clearly mentioned
- No pork, no nuts and no alcohol
- Greasy food should be avoided

Drinks:

- Small sustainable cups will need to be used to serve the drinks
- Traditional drinks may be served but should be in reusable serving containers and not individually packaged
- Hot drinks should not be provided to younger children

Serving the food:

- Tongs and gloves must be used while handling food items
- While serving please serve very small amounts to children to avoid waste. If they like it, they can always come back
- Forks and knives are not permitted
- Spoons should also be avoided. If absolutely necessary, please provide sustainable spoons

Games:

- Please consider sustainability when thinking of which games to offer
- Games should be something you already have at home or borrow from a friend or something you create using sustainable materials
- Signage for the game should also be made from sustainable materials

Displays:

- Please try to use what you have at home or borrow from others instead of buying them
- If crafts or displays are made, please use recycled material and consider how it can be reused or recycled in the future
- Displays must be free standing or placed on the table
- Table cloths will not be provided, please bring your own

Recycling:

- Recycling bins will be provided around the field
- Please ensure they are used during your set up and throughout the event
- Please keep the area in front of your stall clean and encourage students who visit to do the same

Once you have found each other, and connected, we will have a Special Request Form that will be sent out after 21 February. This form can be used for the following special requests:

- Additional Set Up Requirements: extra tables, special set up requests (ex. Extra space needed for specific games), electricity and a power source.
- Request for Live Performances. These cultural performances including dancing and musical performances will be allocated a scheduled time during the day.
- Live Cooking Requests: This request is for countries wishing to set up a live cooking station. Spaces are extremely limited so please organize early and send in the form as soon as it is sent out.
- External Supplier/Vendor/Entertainment Request: This request is for a country wishing to bring in any outside entertainment, vendor or any external non Fairgreen parent or staff participant on campus.
