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Performance Objectives

Communicate a Vision for the Middle Division

Develop and articulate a vision for the Middle Division that serves both current and future students. Consider what potential new practices can be implemented in the short term, but also plan ahead for the inevitable changes with the opening of a new facility in the coming years. Explore potential new offerings across the student experience, including those in the Arts, Athletics, and the academic disciplines.

Nurture a Culture of Thoughtful Change

Implement a curriculum review with a focus on incorporating best practices in middle years curriculum design, while preserving the program's academic excellence. Continue to support professional development opportunities for teachers to stay updated on innovative teaching methods and foster a culture of thoughtful change and continuous improvement in instructional practices. Coordinate with the other division directors to ensure vertical alignment through the full academic program of the school.

Strengthen Middle Division Team Unity

Explore ways to create time for teachers to discuss interdisciplinary curricular ideas across all Middle Division grade levels and academic disciplines. Foster a culture of engagement, excitement, and positivity within the Middle Division team. Maintain clear and consistent professional expectations and accountability, while simultaneously providing high levels of support.

Facilitate Effective Communication and Parental Engagement

Build and foster strong parent relationships through regular engagement and programming, including the transition to the Middle Division and the secondary school selection process. Develop a communication plan for how changes, especially those related to the new building, will be incorporated and communicated to families. Nurture parent relationships through a culture of engagement, excitement, and positivity.

Build and Celebrate a Community Enriched by Diverse Perspectives

Support an inclusive school community in which all members feel they belong, matter, and that their voices are important. Partner with the admissions office to create strategies to attract and enroll a more diverse student body. Ensure hiring practices are designed to attract and retain teachers of excellence, with an eye to building a more diverse faculty.







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The Position

Essential Job Responsibilities

- Serve as the educational leader for the Middle Division, developing and articulating school and subject goals, course objectives, etc.
- Ensure alignment between school mission, vision, values, and all activities of the Middle Division.
- Implement a program and philosophy that achieve the goals set forth in the 2022 Strategic Plan.
- Function as chief articulator of the division's programs, expectations, and behavioral guidelines.
- Promote a safe and supportive school climate where optimal learning can take place.
- In collaboration with the Head of School, oversee the hiring, onboarding, retention, termination, and assignment of faculty and staff.
- Conduct regular staff meetings with faculty and staff.
- Assist with programs for the orientation of new teachers and in-service training of all teachers, ensuring that teachers are familiar with and adhere to school policies in all areas.
- Serve as a consultant to faculty in matters of classroom management, teaching methods, and school procedures.
- Prepare a master division class schedule and assign teachers and students to classes and other obligations.
- Facilitate professional growth and communication among the Middle Division faculty.



- Oversee curriculum development and implementation along with faculty members.
- Establish supportive relationships with faculty, provide coaching and mentoring for Middle Division faculty who are new or otherwise in need of assistance.
- Working with the Assistant Middle Division Director, oversee the coordination of the co-curricular and extracurricular activity programs of the Middle Division.
- Maintain student discipline consistent with school policy.
- Attend Middle Division athletic and extracurricular events.
- Support the transition of students to programs after St. John's.
- Communicate with Middle Division families and the St. John's community-at-large regarding Middle Division activities, events, and other issues.
- Collaborate with the Athletic Director to see that all sports activities are administered in accordance with school philosophy and expectations.
- Support the admission and re-enrollment activities for the Middle Division and coordinate activities to introduce Grade 5 families and students to the division.
- Assist the Head of School and Chief Financial Officer/Chief Operations Officer in carrying out school policies, budgets, and business practices.
- Work with the Director of Enrollment Management throughout the admissions process including evaluating candidates and participating in enrollment decision making.
- Attend parent conferences and other parent meetings as necessary.





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The School

Episcopal Identity

As the oldest Episcopal school in Central Florida and the second oldest in the state, St. John's has a foundation in the Christian faith. Across all three of its campuses, St. John's seeks to integrate religious and spiritual formation into the overall curriculum and life of the school community. In doing so, however, they celebrate the inclusiveness that is the mission of Episcopal schools. All who attend and work at St. John's – Episcopalians and non-Episcopalians, Christians and non-Christians, people with no faith tradition – are invited both to seek clarity about their own beliefs and religions and to honor those traditions more fully and faithfully in their own lives.

Through daily chapel, St. John's students have an opportunity to consider how they lead lives of service and integrity. Furthermore, attending chapel encourages the school community to encourage one another. Above all, St. John's exists not merely to educate but to demonstrate and proclaim the unique worth and beauty of all human beings as creations of a loving, empowering God.

Primary Division

Welcoming Grades K(4) and K(5), the Primary Division focuses on the development of the whole child. The experienced teachers understand the needs and talents of four-and five-year-olds and have crafted a curriculum and structured daily routine to play to their distinctive strengths. This curriculum nurtures growth in all areas of childhood development: cognitive, physical, personal-social, creative, and spiritual. The supportive and caring peer group and school setting enables each child to receive nourishment of both the social and emotional skills needed to succeed in the classroom and in life. By placing emphasis on the building blocks of phonics, handwriting, and mathematics, the program ensures that students matriculate to the Lower Division as prepared, proficient readers, writers, and mathematical problem solvers.

experience geared towards helping each student develop and implement ideas while demonstrating creativity, critical thinking, collaboration, and communication skills. Within this nurturing and stimulating environment, there is a strong emphasis on building character and empathy as students learn about their world. The curriculum provides a strong foundation in literature-based reading, phonics, writing, hands-on mathematics, social studies, and technology. Specialist teachers also work with students during the week in the areas of art, music, science, library, Innovation, and physical education.

Lower Division students gain leadership skills such as selfawareness, accountability, self-motivation, and collaboration through character education. As the oldest members of Lower Division campus, Grade 4 students serve as reading partners for Grade 1 students, car door openers during morning drop-off, and as readers and acolytes for the Eucharist service once per week.

Middle Division

Academics

The Middle Division program, welcoming Grades 5-8, is grounded in the understanding that students are changing developmentally in unique ways as they enter adolescence. As such, Grade 5 is a transition year from their elementary to middle level education. Classrooms are located on the second floor and next to their lockers so students can easily find their way around and move from room to room. The Grade 5 teaching team provides guidance and support to ease them into the Middle Division experience.

A Middle Division student's day is composed of five above grade level academic classes (English, Science, Social Studies, Math, & Foreign Language), four rotating Fine Arts classes (Art, Music, Innovation, and Divinity), and Physical Education. Each subject is taught by content specialized teachers who are dedicated to their subject areas and students. The 'one-to-one' iPad program is thoughtfully and strategically used to enhance collaboration, digital and information literacy, project-based learning, and differentiation.

Graduate Success

The Middle Division program at St. John's is renowned among Central Florida for preparing students for future success at the secondary school level, whether in the most competitive independent schools or public high schools. The curriculum is designed to provide increasingly challenging and vigorous academic course work. These exceptional academics are attested by the continued success of graduates in their high school experiences. On average, 95% of students are accepted into their 'first choice' private high school, with schools ranging among South Tampa's premier high schools, including Academy of the Holy Names, Berkeley Prep, Jesuit High School, Tampa Prep, and the local IB programs.



'A Place to Grow' Capital Campaign

Renowned for over 70 years of educational excellence in the Tampa community, St. John's envisions a campus that supports unprecedented opportunities to transform the lives of current and future generations of children. The new campus will provide spacious classrooms to support innovative teaching and learning, dedicated outdoor spaces for play, expansion of the performing arts, state-of-the-art spaces for robotics, STEM, video production, technology integration, and so much more.

Opportunities for Exploration

St. John's recognizes the Middle Division as a developmentally appropriate period of time for exploration among extracurriculars. Thus, students are encouraged to participate in multiple activities – and the school's no-cut policy ensures these opportunities may come to fruition. Whether participating in one of St. John's 14 athletic teams, the visual and performing arts, music, or one of St. John's after-school enrichment offerings, students graduate from the Middle Division with confidence in the pursuit of new interests and more excitement toward contributing to their secondary school in meaningful ways.

Middle Division Experiential Learning

While local experiential learning is available to all students, each Middle Division class participates in a developmentally appropriate experiential learning opportunity: Grade 5 swims with the manatees in Florida Springs; Grade 6 enjoys the historical sites of St. Augustine; Grade 7 hikes the Everglades and snorkels with tropical fish in the Florida Keys; and Grade 8 journeys to the majestic sites of Yosemite. These experiences not only enrich students' learning through curriculum-based concepts but also preserve tradition as students anticipate and enjoy each trip throughout their time in the Middle Division.
