9-12 First Choice Flex Presentations / Job Shadowing:

- Sight and Sound Job Shadowing Day, Friday, February 16th-This shadow day was specifically for students to observe and experience a "day-in-the-life" of the Show Operations teams. Throughout the day, people from different Show Operation departments spoke on show information, context, and answered any questions about this career. This Show Operations shadow day was created to provide a shadowing experience for students who have a specific interest in the arts and live theater and a passion for what we do at Sight & Sound. 



I saw professionalism demonstrated from mainly juniors/seniors in the form of handshakes, introductions, making eye contact, and asking questions. I also appreciated the two young ladies who asked if I needed help tearing down at the end of the fair.

I thought the set up was great! We weren't able to secure jobs for any students because of the nature of our company but did offer future insight on what they could do after high school. We also were able to connect with students on what it would look like to maybe work part time on our retail team but guided them to our website. All of the students were kind, engaging, and open to conversation!

I did like the question form the students had with them.

Although, I did not schedule a job shadow, we did get leads. I would prefer not to schedule at the job fair, but rather let them know about it and see who takes the intiative to reach out to us.

Potential internships would be booked after the student has had a chance to do a job shadow.

I would say maybe it could be beneficial to ask the students to stop at each table and at least take a handout. We didn't talk to as many students as we would've liked, and not everyone needs to have a long-winded conversation, but at least we could give information to as many people as possible.

The students seemed more willing and motivated to engage in conversation with business reps. Overall the students were respectful and friendly.

It was strong! I thought the time for each period was good, it was nice to have 11th and 12th graders together, and nice to have them have questions they were suggested to ask us.

Students seemed very engaged and wanting more information, it was fantastic! Do the students get time in advance to see who is going to be there, research the companies to prepare questions, decide which booths they definitely want to visit, etc.? It may help them utilize their time better during the actual event.
