The staging area includes the staff and student parking areas east of the high school and Davison Alternative Education. **Motorists should also take note that the Oak Road entrance to the high school will be closed by 4 p.m., so please use the Lapeer Road entrance.**

This year's parade begins at 5 p.m. at Davison High School. The parade will continue west down Clark Street and turn north on Main Street before ending near the library. Please use extreme caution when driving in this area as school buses will be picking up students along Fourth and Davison streets to bring them back to the high school.

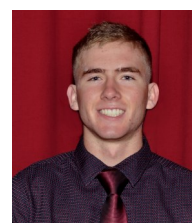

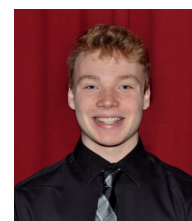
