Sarai Lacy reported that the high school is busy preparing for 8th grade tours.

STUDENT REPRESENTATIVE

CRA senior Mariah Vega presented the following update from the Crater Campus:

- CAHPS teacher Mr. Hamilton was recently able to move back into his recently updated classroom
- Mr. Miller's construction class is nearing completion on the new green house
- Mr. Kenner's physical science classes recently hosted Gizmo Day, an opportunity for over 400 elementary students to visit campus for a hands-on science fair
- BIS Exhibition Night returned after a two-year hiatus with over 80% of students attending with their families
- CRA Land Lab hosted the Southern Oregon Regional Envirothon (SORE) with four regional high school teams participating in various activities and demonstrations; they also hosted a mini-Envirothon for Scenic 8th grade science classes
- CRA Student Congress will host a school-wide assembly to promote positive school culture
- DECA recently returned from the State Career Development Conference with nine students advancing to the International Career Development Conference to be held in Orlando, FL in late April
- National Honor Society will have a ceremony in mid-April to celebrate academic achievements and community service
- Spring sports: track and field, baseball, softball, and boys and girls golf are underway
- Pre-ACT exams are being offered to all sophomore students on campus during the first week of April
- Students from Crater will attend the Black Youth Leadership Summit hosted by SOU to promote cultural awareness, community engagement, personal growth, and self-efficacy
- 8th grade tours and a parent night will be held April 10-11
- Juniors and seniors will attend the Careers in Gear Fair at the Expo on April 27 where they will meet with employers in a wide range of occupations, careers, and programs of study
- Auditions for the spring play, *The Play that Goes Wrong*, just wrapped up

SITE SHOWCASE, CRATER SCHOOL OF BUSINESS, INNOVATION AND SCIENCE

Principal Scott Dippel spoke about the district work around our mission, vision, and core values and how that inspired the BIS mission. He introduced **Bryan Gonzalez** who shared his experience working toward his associate degree with dual enrollment at KCC, as well as classes at SOU. He feels he is well prepared for rigorous academics as he moves on to college. **Abby Foster** shared that she has been taking college classes at OIT since she was a junior. She has one full year of college classes completed as she works toward a medical imaging degree. Teacher Marcella Six spoke about the CNA certification program that partners with Pacific Health Care to offer students a career path beginning in high school. She shared an email from **Ariana Almazan** who said the program provided her with purpose and a connection to school. SWS Jeremy Sinks demonstrated the BIS vision by introducing **Danica Fuller** to share her biology project on gel electrophoresis, a technique in which you separate charged molecules (DNA, RNA, and proteins) based on size. **Noah Dornbusch** and **Evan Alfrey** demonstrated the catapults they made in physics and explained the math element of their project. **Hunter Versteegen** showcased the pendulum he made at CraterWorks as part of a math problem based on the Edgar Allen Poe poem *The Pit and the Pendulum*. SSC Kristen Sullivan shared the BIS values and how they are incorporated into classrooms. CSB teacher Rianna Lee spoke about their entrepreneurship project where students create a business and they are evaluated, among other things, on uniqueness, and long-term viability. **Emelia Prince**, **Suzy Foster**, and **Taylor Kenworthy** shared their project on opening a Krispy Kreme Doughnuts on Pine Street. Iwan Meeker introduced **Brodie Sparkman**

and **Chase Kerr** from his design competition class to share their 3D printing projects, including a full-scale model of a truck shift knob.

FINANCIAL REPORT

Kami provided the following update for February 2023:

- ODE enrollment reporting remains consistent, contributing to the district's overall stable state funding
- The district recently submitted the High-Cost Disability report for FY21-22
- The district received the second Common School Fund Disbursement for a total of \$572K
- A final decision from the State is still pending regarding next year's state and grant funding for the biennium
- The district's estimated ending fund balance is approximately \$2.9M

OUT OF COUNTRY TRAVEL

CRA Principal Jen Spencer presented a request for World Traveler's Club proposed trip to France in the spring of 2025. D6EA MOA

Tom presented a Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) between the D6 Education Association (D6EA) and the Central Point School District regarding working conditions for specialists (e.g., speech language pathologists and school psychologists). The goal is to have specialists work their full FTE on site, the MOA addresses instances where that is not possible. The Board will be asked to vote on this matter at the April 18, 2023 meeting.

OSEA47 MOA

Tom presented a Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) between the Oregon School Employees Association Chapter 47 (OSEA47) and the Central Point School District regarding compensation addressed during bargaining last year. Restructuring of the pay scale had unanticipated impacts that are addressed with this MOA. The district worked with the Association to create a new step to honor the time of service for all members and the intent of bargaining. The Board of Directors approved the MOA between the OSEA Chapter 47 and the Central Point School District regarding placement on the salary schedule as presented.

INTEGRATED GUIDANCE APPLICATION & ACTIVITIES BUDGET

At the last meeting, Christine presented the district's Integrated Guidance Plan, including the application and budget. Integrated planning feedback from staff and the community, that resulted in a slight revision to the

budget, was shared tonight. The Board of Directors approved the district's Integrated Guidance application and budget as presented.
